

2017-2018 Official State Highway and Transportation Map

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- GA State Code 32-4-2(a)(1): The department shall prepare an official map showing all public roads on the state highway system....as soon as is reasonably possible....shall be filed with the Secretary of State
- OTD biennially produces Georgia's Official State Highway and Transportation Map (also known as the State Map) primarily for road navigation.
- OTD printed approximately 1.1 million 2017-2018 State Maps.
- The State Maps are freely distributed to Georgia Welcome Centers and to the public upon request.



- A new **high quality paper** stock has been selected to provide more vibrant colors, increase durability, and improve image resolution.
- The roadway network is an estimated 26% larger resulting in an **easier-to-read product**.
- To focus the viewer's gaze on the State of Georgia, a shaded relief in a warm beige color displays the surface elevation of the surrounding states.
- An **updated mileage chart** shows a wider geographic distribution of the cities across the state.





- The hydrography layer has been updated, which means more lakes, rivers and streams are shown.

 - Front


Appalachian Trail, Athens, Atlanta, Augusta, Dalton*, Downtown Atlanta, Gainesville, Macon, and Rome.

Albany, Columbus, Hinesville*, Savannah, Statesboro, Valdosta, and Warner Robins.




Road Systems
