



#### Jan 30<sup>th</sup>—House Transportation Committee Meeting

- Special Subcommittee on Local Maintenance and Improvement Grants (LMIG) 2019 Report:
  - History of the Local Aid Programs
  - Input from Local Governments (ACCG/GMA)
  - No formal Recommendations
- H.R. 935 extending the Georgia Commission on Freight and Logistics through December 31, 2020.
- H.B. 820 creating Georgia Freight Railroad Program
  - New GDOT budget program, subject to annual appropriations
  - Focused on (1) Rail Enhancement; (2) Rail Preservation; and (3) Industrial Rail.



#### Feb 4<sup>th</sup>—Senate Transportation Committee Meeting

- Presentation of Chairman Tanner's Proposed Substitute to **HB 511**:
  - **Transit Funding:** authorizes single county Transit SPLOSTs and converts sales tax on ride shares to a 50¢ per ride excise tax (excise revenue would be dedicated to transit).
  - **Governance:** Transit and Mobility Innovations Division housed within GDOT with mobility zone structure and 3 pilot programs.
  - Healthcare Mobility Transit Coordination Commission: to review and make recommendations on the administrative consolidation of transit programs from other state agencies into the new division.
- S.R. 654—Constitutional Amendment to expand authorized use of motor fuel tax revenue from roads and bridges to "public transportation" including but "not limited" to "roads, bridges, rails, airports, buses, seaports, and all accompanying infrastructure and services necessary to provide access to these public transportation facilities."



## **Current Federal Reauthorization Proposals**

Senate EPW Committee <u>"ATIA" Draft Bill (July</u>

- \$287B in **Angle W** spending over 5 years (\$110B in general funds required).
- Codifies the key components of "One Federal Decision."
- Preserves the FAST Act Funding Programs with additions: resiliency, carbon reduction, & electric refueling stations.

House T&I Committee (Jan. 2020) "Moving Forward" \$3295 in Inginway spending over 5 years and \$105B in transit.

• Amend core programs to prioritize "fix it first," resiliency, and expand sub-allocated funding. President Trump's (Feb. 2020) • <u>"HIAI" Proposal Outlines.</u>

- \$810B for funding surface transportation (12% increase).
- \$190B for "one-time" grants across all infrastructure: transportation, water, & telecommunications.
