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

47 U.S.C. Telecommunications

- Telecom Act of 1934 FCC created
 - Telephone and radio connections
 nationwide
 - American Telephone and Telegraph Company
- Telecom Act of 1996 Internet
 - Deregulation Competition "Telecom (Fiber) Boom"
 - Preemption of Local authority
 - "Require fair and reasonable compensation from telecommunications providers"
- 2018 Accelerating Wireless Broadband Deployment
 - Establishes "shot clocks" for permitting
 - Presumably reasonable fees/rates



U.S. Telecommunications Act of 1996



encourage deployment of advanced telecom capabilities, including broadband to all Americans Goal: "intramodal" competition – voice over circuit switched net, local/long distance



growth in broadband Internet access to U.S. homes











Technological Advancements & National Research

Redefine Trunk Communications and Long Distance Cable

- "Broadband" = High Speed internet Access
 - Copper Lines
 - Coaxial Cable
 - Fiber optics
 - Wireless





Broadband Services: Wired or wireless service that consists of the capability to transmit data to and from end users and in combination with such service provides: (1) Access to the internet; (2) Computer processing, information storage, or protocol conversion; or (3) Any application or information content to be provided over or through broadband.





Land Values

Examined Land Values across the state

- Tax Assessor Data
- Project Right-of-Way Expenditures
 - Urban
 - Rural
 - Residential
 - Commercial
 - Agricultural
- Cost per acre varies greatly across the state





Formula Based with Indexing

- Producer Price Index (PPI)
- Consumer Price Index (CPI)
- National Highway Construction Cost Index (NHCCI)
- No clear "across the board" utility applicability

Per Permit Based Fee

- Proportional Share of Operating Costs
- Technology Agnostic
- FCC Declaratory Ruling
- Streamlining Wireless Act (SB 66)
- Viable path forward

Per Permit Fee with Recurring Rate

- \checkmark Allows for uniformity in programmatic impact
- \checkmark Provides more predictable rates for the industry
- ✓ Technology agnostic
- ✓ Consistent with FCC Declaratory Ruling
 - "Presumably Reasonable" Maximum Permit fee
 - "Presumably Reasonable" Recurring Rate
- Consistent with Streaming Wireless Act (SB 66) Local Government Only
 - Establishes Maximum Application Fee
 - Establishes Maximum Recurring Fee
 - 2.5% Annual Increase
- ✓ Operational Cost Compatible
- ✓ Gradual Implementation
