#### **FAST FACTS**


- 7.4 million trips (Over 26,500 weekday average)
- Travel Speeds 30% faster than General Purpose
- Rush Hour reduced by one hour in length (AM & PM)
- Highest Posted Fare \$5.95
- Reversing twice per day (TMC & HERO)
- No Fatalities in system





#### **More Detail**


- August 2019 recorded the highest number of trips at 740,882. This is a 3% growth from the previous highest month (May 2019)
- Week of Aug 29 was busiest week with an average of 31,758 trips per workday

General Purpose	54.5 mph	52.4 mph






# **Northwest Corridor Express Lane Volumes**






# I-75 SB from I-575 to I-285 Volume Comparison






## I-75 SB from I-575 to I-285 Travel Time Comparison






### I-75 From I-575 to I-285 SB March 2016

# **Typical Reversal Durations**



I-75 South Metro Corridor: 45 minutes

Northwest Corridor: 90 minutes

Reversals are done in a "rolling" style – where the gates are closed sequentially from one end of the corridor to the other (in the direction of travel), and opened in the opposite direction as the operation progresses.

HEROs are staged at each gate set and observe the operation in conjunction with TMC operators watching on camera.



# **Interoperability Statistics**


- System is interoperable with Florida's Sunpass and North Carolina's QuickPass
- Of the 7.4 million trips taken in the first year of operation, 382,292 were taken by vehicles with interop passes
- This amounts to approx. 0.5% of total trips



Georgia DOT: New toll lanes have cut rush hour traffic congestion





The Northwest Corridor Express Lanes have had a big impact on traffic, increasing travel speeds and shrinking rush hour on I-75, according to the Georgia Department of Transportation.
