## **2018 Legislative Session**

### **Proposed Legislative Agenda Policy**

- Policy recommendations presented to the Legislative Committee on November 15<sup>th</sup>.
- Policy recommendations considered for approval by the Legislative Committee on December 13<sup>th</sup> and the full State Transportation Board on December 14<sup>th</sup>.
- Recommendations aim to further streamline and improve the process for surplus right-of-way disposal/leasing; and to update the pre-bid construction worksite inspection requirements and the construction bid process to ensure consistency on electronic submission and clarify deadlines to ensure the best bids possible; and Title 40 operations and access update.



## **2018 Legislative Session**

### **Proposed Legislative Agenda Policy**

- Surplus right-of-way disposal/leasing
  - Ensure consistency and flexibility across the various methods of disposal: prior owner/successor-in-title sales, sealed bid sales, real estate broker sales, and public auctions. Ensure similar thresholds for leasing.
- Pre-bid construction worksite inspection requirements
  - Ensure this requirements apply to state-funded projects.
- Construction bid submission process
  - Ensure consistency with respect to electronic submission and clarify critical path deadlines to ensure the best bids possible;
- Title 40 Operations and Access Updates

# **2017 Study Committees**

- House Commission on Transit Governance & Funding
  - Focus on mass transportation planning & funding.
  - 5 Meetings—Capitol (6/29); MARTA HQ (8/2); ARC HQ (10/10); Columbus (11/13); and Savannah (12/6).
  - Abolishes on 12/31/18; may be extended to 12/31/19
- House Study Committee on Distracted Driving
  - Focus on need for legislative changes to address distracted driving.
  - 4 Meetings—Capitol (8/28); Warner Robbins (9/25); Savannah (10/10); and Alpharetta (10/30).
  - Abolished on 12/01/17.
- Joint Study Committee on Stream Buffers in Georgia
  - Focus on balancing private property rights and water protection.
  - ➢ 3 Meetings—Capitol: Oct. 13<sup>th</sup>; Nov. 9<sup>th</sup>; & Dec. 13<sup>th</sup>.
  - Abolishes on 12/31/17.



## **Federal Funding Overview**

#### Authorization vs. Appropriation

FAST Act authorized apportionment levels for 5 years expiring September 30, 2020.

Limitation on **obligation authority** restricts the amount of obligation in a single fiscal year.

**Annual appropriation** liquidates the obligation to allow for the reimbursement to the state of authorized costs incurred.



As a result of the current Continuing Resolution (expires December 22<sup>nd</sup>), <u>only \$225M</u> <u>in FHWA funds</u> were made available to Georgia.





- Federal FY2018 Appropriations
  - Current Continuing Resolution expires on December 22<sup>nd</sup>.
  - \$225M in federal funds available to date.
- Advanced Construction (AC)
  - GDOT has advanced federal projects with \$549M in state funds since the start of GAFY18.
  - \$105M in AC conversions brings total to a \$444M balance just since the start of GAFY18.
  - Long-term FFY18 Appropriations required to avoid indefinite interruption of lettings as early as March 2018.
