

House Transit Governance & Funding Commission Progress Update

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




House Commission Background

- Purpose: study Georgia's transit needs and the state's role in administering and delivering transit services
- HB 848 (2017 Legislative Session) Established the House Commission on Transit Governance and Funding
- Membership: 6 GA House Reps, 4 transit provider reps, 4 GA residents appointed by Speaker, agency ex officio members (GDOT, GRTA, MARTA, MPO directors)
- Initial work resulted in HB 930 and the ATL transit governing body
- Current work focuses on governance structures and funding in rural Georgia
- Four meetings during 2018
- Final report expected in January 2019

Current Funding Sources and Flow






October Meeting Discussions

Preliminary Governance Concepts:

- Consolidated State Rural Transit Authority: Policy/compliance, statewide planning, funding allocations; Housed within existing agency TBD
- Rural Transit Coordination Council: would oversee the authority and have representatives from multiple state agencies
- 3. Regional "Mobility Zones": Coordinate regional plans, contract & service delivery administration
