



Transportation Alternatives Call for Projects

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FY 2019 Call for Transportation Alternative Program (TAP) Projects

- Federal funding for TAP projects is suballocated into populations areas:
 - <5,000 population
 - Between 5,000 and 200,000 population
 - Over 200,000 (MPOs program projects)
- GDOT advertised a call for applications in May 2018 for the population areas under 5,000 and between 5,000 and 200,000
- There were a total of thirty (30) TAP applications received
- Twenty-three (23) applications were received from areas of the state with populations between 5,000 and 200,000
- Seven (7) applications were received from areas of the state with populations less than 5,000

TAP Applications Selected for Award in Population Areas between 5,000 and 200,000

- Eight (8) applications were selected for award for areas of the state with population between 5,000 and 200,000
- The applications selected for award were submitted by local public agencies (LPAs) that are Local Administered Project (LAP) certified or from LPAs that are currently in the process of becoming LAP certified
- The federal funding available for TAP projects for this population area of the state is \$2,900,000 for fiscal year 2019 and the entire amount is being awarded to the 8 LPAs selected for award
- The funding will be awarded for the Preliminary Engineering (PE) phase for each project

TAP Applications Selected for Award in Population Areas Under 5,000

- Seven (7) applications submitted; all were selected for award in areas of the state with population less than 5,000
- The total value of the awards is \$2,230,000
- The federal funding available for TAP projects for these population areas of the state is \$4,300,000 for fiscal year 2019
- The funding will be awarded for the Preliminary Engineering (PE) phase for each project selected for award

- Local Governments will be notified of awards immediately
- A call for projects for fiscal year 2020 TAP funding is anticipated in March 2019
- The call in March 2019 will be for the cities and counties in the same two suballocated population areas:
 - <5,000 population
 - Between 5,000 and 200,000 population
