Sir, as a resident of Dawson County I feel that I must comment on the proposed flyover at the intersection of GA. 400 and Hwy. 53. It is my view that this project will greatly diminish the promising nascent economic development that has sprouted up in the area in the last few years. I am not a merchant so I have no "axe to grind" from that viewpoint, but I have seen how these types of structures can profoundly change the character of a neighborhood in a negative way. The dark alleys and underpasses create areas for trash to proliferate and encourages drug transactions and violence.

Dawsonville is still a rural area, but since the appearance of the Outlet Mall, we have begun to enjoy the benefits of stores and other commercial services that have grown up along these roads. A structure like this will make the town look just like the over-concreted bedroom communities to our south and will discourage any further merchant activity.

I am certainly not qualified to recommend other solutions for the traffic issues at this intersection, but there must be alternatives. Additional turn lanes, more lights or perhaps doing nothing at all might be the answer. Yes, it is true that development has made that intersection a challenge, but the question that I have to ask is why recommend a flyover for a road that ends 15 miles further to the north in the mountains? There will be no connection to an interstate, and no large metropolitan area that needs to be served by large tractor-trailer rigs.

I believe that as the residents of Dawson County become more aware of the DOT's intentions for this area there will be a very vocal opposition. I attended the DOT briefing Tuesday and I did not meet a single resident in favor of this project. I only hope that this is not considered a "done deal" and that there will be serious attention paid to the input of the residents of Dawson County.
