
STUDY OVERVIEW

The Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT) has recently partnered with Lumpkin and White County to increase accessibility and ease of travel within the community while addressing safety and geometric concerns in anticipation of the 2023 opening of the Northeast Georgia Medical Center south of the intersection of SR 115 and SR 60. A plan was developed to determine the Counties’ current and future transportation needs through the year 2055, and identify projects that address community needs and promote economic vitality and quality of life.

Much of Lumpkin and White County are comprised of land that is characterized as rural, with low population and employment. Understanding this, the study will especially focus on smaller-scale roadway improvements, such as passing lanes, intersection improvements, and paving projects, as well as bridge upgrades that will serve community mobility into the future.
