thoroughfare for settlers traveling across the Georgia hinterland. Major cities such as Augusta, Milledgeville, Macon, and Columbus sprang up along this road as it became more heavily traveled. The Cherokee road of 1805 was equally as valuable because it opened up a gateway connecting Georgia with northern Alabama and Western

Tennessee.

The nomenclature of Georgia roads is reminiscent of a colorful, romantic and imaginative era. Road names like Smutt-Eye Road, Gold Diggers Road, Sloss Eye Road, Seven Islands Road, Alligator State Road, and Sand Town Trail suggest the imagination of our
