

What is the SWTP/SSTP?

The **Statewide Transportation Plan**, also known as the SWTP, is Georgia's federally mandated long-range transportation plan that outlines general and investment policies within at least a 20-year window into the future. The plan was last updated in 2015 for horizon year 2040. The plan is now being updated for horizon year 2050. The **Statewide Strategic Transportation Plan**, also known as the SSTP, is a state mandated plan that outlines specific investment strategies identified to advance economic growth in the State of Georgia. The SSTP was most recently updated in 2018.

How is the SWTP/SSTP Developed?

The SWTP/SSTP is developed in coordination with the citizens of Georgia, interested stakeholders, and in direct cooperation with local governments to prioritize investment and then inform more specific plans for program funding. Topics addressed with this effort include existing conditions, needs and preferences, tradeoff analysis, revenue forecast, economic forecast, evaluation of future deficiencies, economic impact of investment, and public and stakeholder input.

Why Should I Become Involved?

The SWTP/SSTP Public Involvement Process gives all citizens and interested stakeholders the opportunity to review and comment on the State's transportation priorities for the future. The public is encouraged to become involved and provide GDOT with thoughts, suggestions, and information about transportation needs for Georgia.
