NTD reporting is a federal requirement

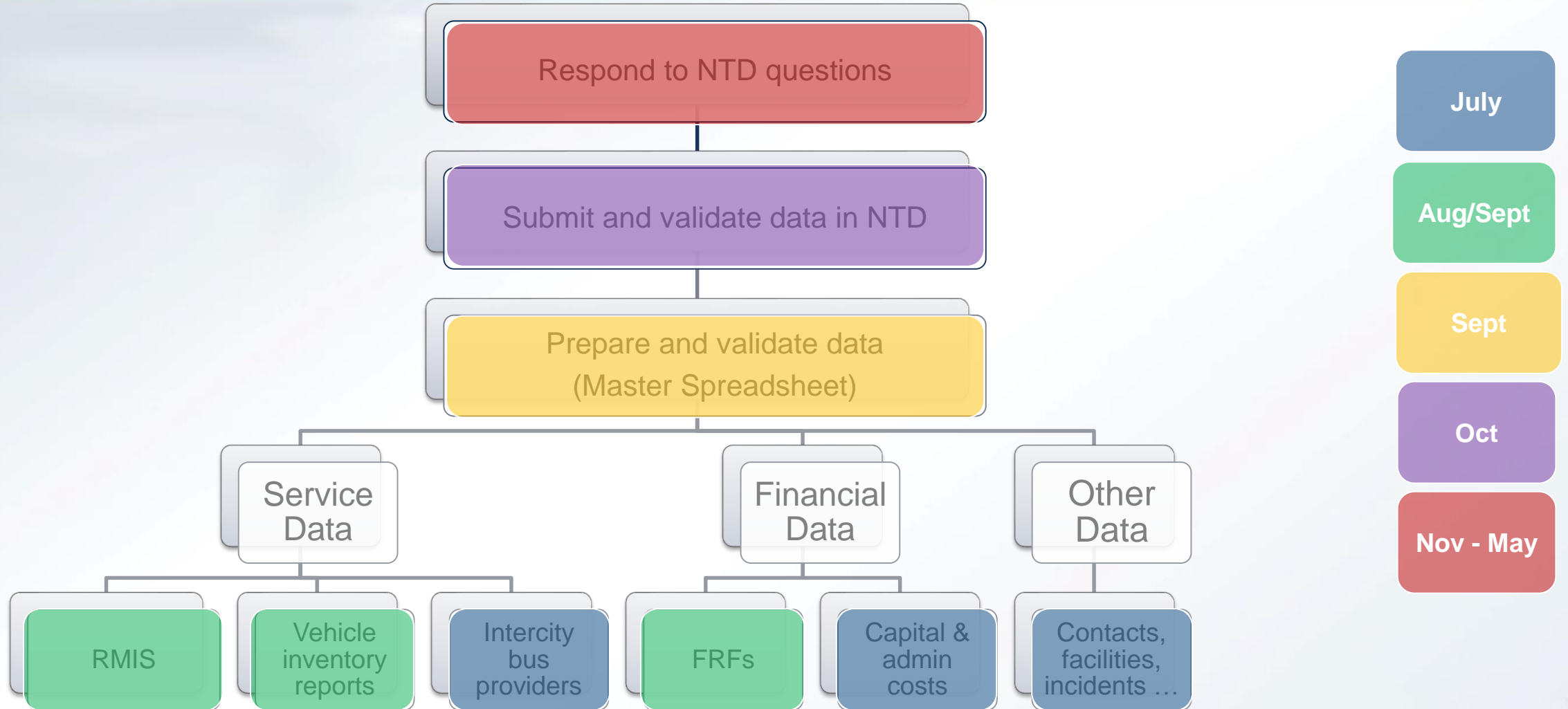
“Those receiving funding from the Urbanized Area Formula Program (5307) or Rural Formula Program (5311) – are required to submit data to the NTD in uniform categories. More than 660 transit providers report to the NTD through the Internet-based system.”

Some “interesting” facts

1

Georgia has the **largest number** of sub-recipients in the nation!

2

We manually enter **more than 4,000** data items into NTD each year (about 50 items per sub-recipient)

3

We prepare **between 500 – 1,000** responses to validation questions raised by NTD each year

- 518 at time of submission + 24 follow-up in FY17
- PTC and sub-recipient comments on why vehicles are out of service on a given month are crucial to our ability to respond

Typical reporting questions

1

What is a “reportable incident”?

2

Which “FRF” is used for NTD reporting?

3

What is a “snapshot” view?

A reportable incidence meets at least one of the following:

1

A **fatality**

2

An injury in which the individual was transported from the scene by an **ambulance**

3

A collision that resulted in property damage of **\$25,000** or more

4

Collisions involving transit revenue vehicles that require **towing** away from the scene

5

An **evacuation** for life safety reasons

FRFs used in NTD reporting

For sub-recipients that expend 5311 funds before the end of the fiscal year, we need to obtain a FRF that captures all expenditures for the year, i.e., a **“June FRF”**

“Snapshot” view

When reporting vehicles, facilities, and other information, if something has changed during the fiscal year NTD uses **June 30th** as the “snapshot” date, i.e., what was the state of the system as of this date?
