I-85 LANE CLOSURES BEGINNING AT EXIT 56

COWETA County – The Georgia Department of Transportation announces nightly lane closures on Interstate 85 near Exit 56 (Collinsworth Road/CR 548) beginning Monday, August 10, through Saturday, August 15. The closures are subject to change based on weather conditions.

Interstate 85 Northbound Lane Closures

Monday, August 10, nightly through Wednesday, August 12

Near mileposts 57-61

TIME: 9 p.m. – 5 a.m.

1 *right* lane closed; 2 lanes remain open to traffic

For work beginning near Exit 56 (Collinsworth Road/CR 548)

Interstate 85 Northbound Lane Closures

Thursday, August 13, nightly through Saturday, August 15

Near mileposts 57-61

TIME: 9 p.m. – 5 a.m.

1 *left* lane closed; 2 lanes remain open to traffic

For work beginning near Exit 56 (Collinsworth Road/CR 548)

The scheduled completion date for this project is December 31, 2009. Motorists should expect shoulder and lane closures on a continuing basis and are advised to use extra caution in construction work zones.

Speed limits have been reduced and will be strictly enforced. Message boards, signs, barricades, barrels and cones will be utilized to alert and channel motorists through the area.

Georgia DOT urges travelers to call 511 for updated information about this or any other construction project on interstates and state routes. Georgia 511 is a free phone service that provides real-time traffic and travel information statewide, such as traffic conditions, incidents, lane closures, and delays due to inclement weather.
