GEORGIA DOT ROAD WORK BRINGING CHANGES TO SR 369 AT WALDRIP CIRCLE IN FORSYTH COUNTY

CUMMING, Ga. – Georgia DOT announces road work will change traffic at State Route 369 and Waldrip Circle at the Oscarville Store next Tuesday, 17th if weather permits.

“Next week, the existing intersection of 369 and Waldrip Circle will close to traffic so we can work in that area. Traffic will be able to access the area from Vann’s Tavern Road. Once construction is complete, Waldrip Circle will shift behind Oscarville Store and line up across State Route 369 with McBride Road. The current intersection of Waldrip Circle and State Route 369 will be closed, no longer allowing access between the two. Please use extreme caution in the area as people get used to the detour,” explained Georgia DOT District Construction Engineer, Randall Davis.

This is the last intersection along State Route 369 to be upgraded along the corridor finishing the operational improvements developed with The project completion date is October 31, 2011 and the project is on schedule.

Motorists can access real-time, statewide, route-specific information on accidents, road work, traffic and weather conditions through **Georgia 511** - a free phone, web, and mobile service. By dialing 511, callers also can transfer to operators 24 hours a day to report incidents or request assistance.
