## MONDAY AND WEDNESDAY LANE CLOSURES ON SR 400 CUMMING, WEATHER PERMITTING

- WHERE:** State Route 400 under Buford Dam Road Overpass in Cumming
- WHEN:** Monday, August 1 and Wednesday, August 3 beginning at 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. as weather permits
- WHY:** The City of Cumming has a construction project underway on Buford Dam Road. Next week this work will impact SR 400 as crews on Buford Dam Road work.
- WHAT:** One of the two southbound lanes of State Route 400 will close Monday as crews work overhead. The right southbound lane will close first, at 9 a.m. to traffic. As work progresses, the right lane will be opened and the left lane closed until 3:30 p.m. while crews are working overhead.
- Wednesday, work moves to SR 400 northbound closing the left or outside lane at 9 a.m. and switching to open the left lane and close the right lane until 3:30 p.m. while work occurs overhead.

Motorists can access real-time, statewide, route-specific information on accidents, road work, traffic and weather conditions through **Georgia 511** - a free phone, web, and mobile service. By dialing 511, callers also can transfer to operators 24 hours a day to report incidents or request assistance. The system can be used to access transit providers, major airports, rideshare organizations, tourism information and 511 systems in surrounding states. Additionally, 511 is available online or as a hybrid solution via a free download for your smart phone.
