## NIGHTLY LANE CLOSURES SCHEDULED NEXT WEEK ON I-75 NORTH AND SOUTHBOUND

**WHEN:** 7 p.m. until 7 a.m. nightly, beginning Monday, June 18 through Sunday, June 24, weather permitting

**WHERE:** I-75 north and southbound between mile markers 109 (Exit 109; SR 215/Union Street) and 127 (Exit 127; SR 26).

**WHAT:** The Georgia DOT has been notified by its contractors of a nightly lane closures between mileposts 109 and 127 in Dooly and Houston Counties on I-75 north and southbound.

- *One left lane closed northbound from mile marker 109 to 113, this will be a nightly closure from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. beginning at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, June 19, and ending 7 a.m. on Sunday, June 24. Crews will be pouring the inside shoulder northbound.*
- *One left lane closed southbound from mile marker 113 to 112, this will be a nightly closure from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. beginning at 7 p.m. on Monday, June 18, and ending 7 a.m. on Friday, June 21 to pour southbound approach slabs.*
- *One left lane closed southbound from mile marker 110 to 109, beginning at 7 p.m. Monday, June 18, until 7 a.m., Tuesday, June 19 to pour inside shoulder southbound.*
- *One left lane closed southbound from mile marker 127 to 117, this will be a nightly closure from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. beginning at 7 p.m. on Monday, June 18, and ending 7 a.m. on Friday, June 21. The contractor will be performing work in the median.*

This is a WORK ZONE and extreme caution is necessary. Motorists are advised to reduce speeds as they travel through this construction work zone. Message signs, barrels and cones will be utilized to alert the public of the upcoming changes. Drivers should be aware that personnel and equipment will be operating in close proximity to travel lanes.

Motorists can access real-time, statewide, route-specific information on accidents, road work, traffic and weather conditions through **Georgia 511** - a free phone service. By dialing 511, callers also can transfer to operators to 24 hours a day to report incidents or request assistance. The system can be used to access transit providers, major airports, rideshare organizations, tourism information and 511 systems in surrounding states. Additionally, 511 is available online. Georgia DOT partners with sponsors for assistance in funding 511, thereby preserving tax dollars and helping sustain critical services.
