Striping on I-20 Improvement Project will Close Eastbound Lanes

What: Activity returns to the \$8.9 million Interstate 20 surface improvement project next week in Greene County. The striping sub-contractor will start placing pavement markings heading eastbound beginning the morning of **Monday, August 24** through the evening of **Friday, August 28**, weather permitting. Lane closures will be setup in the roadway to allow for the striping work.

Look for message boards, barrels and persons close to the travel lane. This is a work zone and extreme caution is necessary to ensure the safety of contractors, Georgia DOT personnel and motorists.

Overall, the construction contractor, Interstate Improvement, Inc., will resurface I-20 sections traversing Greene, McDuffie, Taliaferro and Warren counties by late spring of 2016. This identified portion of freeway needs rehabilitation because the existing pavement is deteriorating. Work commenced earlier in 2015 eastbound at mile post 130.2 (Greene) and will eventually run to mile post 172.16 (McDuffie). The total project scope rests within these mile parameters both east and westbound.

When: Weather permitting the striping sub-contractor will start placing pavement markings from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday, August 24 through Friday, August 28.

Where: I-20 Mile post 132 to 136 eastbound in Greene County
