RAILROAD CROSSING MAKEOVER ON U.S. 341/S.R. 27

Weekend Detour for Road Closure

Brunswick, Ga. – At the request of CSX Railroad, the Georgia Department of Transportation in partnership with Glynn County announces a weekend road closure in conjunction with construction on the railroad crossing on U.S. 341/S.R. 27 at mile post 13.45 between Pyles Marsh Road and Cowpen Creek Road in Glynn County. U.S. 341/S.R. 27 will be **closed at the railroad crossing** and traffic detoured from 8 a.m., Saturday, February 16 and remain closed until work is completed on Sunday, February 17, weather permitting.

This railway maintenance operation and the road closures is a necessity to calibrate the railway creating a smooth transition for motorists and reduce continuous maintenance at this rail crossing. Motorists will be able to access businesses, schools, and residences in the area up to work zone.

“Georgia DOT endeavors to work with the community to minimize traffic delays caused by construction and maintenance of the roadways. In an effort to minimize the impact to the traveling public, the work will be accomplished over the weekend,” stated Georgia DOT District Engineer Karon Ivery.

The detour routes will be signed as follows:

- Motorists traveling southbound on U.S. 341/S.R. 27 turn left on to S.R. 99 East at traffic signal in Sterling; travel on S.R. 99 east to I-95; turn right on to I-95 South on ramp then merge on to I-95 South; take Exit 36-A Brunswick U.S. 25/US341 then merge on to U.S. 341/ S.R. 27 South where detour ends.
- Motorists traveling northbound on U.S. 341/S.R.27 take I-95 on ramp; take Exit 42 S.R. 99 off ramp; turn left on to S.R. 99 West; turn right at traffic signal in Sterling on to U.S. 341/S.R. 27 North where detour ends.
- US 341/S.R. 27 will remain open to local traffic up to work zone.

Motorists can access real-time, statewide, route-specific information on accidents, road work, traffic and weather conditions through **Georgia 511** - a free phone service. By dialing 511, callers also can transfer to operators to 24 hours a day to report incidents or request assistance. The system can be used to access transit providers, major airports, rideshare organizations, tourism information and 511 systems in surrounding states. Additionally, 511 is available online.
