GEORGIA DOT ENHANCES SAFETY WITH BETTER ROADWAY VISIBILITY FOR MOTORISTS: Restriping and Pavement Markers Installation Scheduled for Southeast Georgia

WHAT: Rolling lane closures for roadway striping this week in Southeast Georgia. Ozark Striping Company, contractors for Georgia DOT, has scheduled roadway striping and pavement markers installation requiring rolling lane closures on multiple routes in Southeast Georgia, weather permitting.

Please be reminded reflective lane stripes improve roadway visibility helping drivers see the road at night and in the rain.

DO NOT pass the paint truck or trail/buffer vehicle.

DO NOT change lanes behind the striping truck or trail/buffer vehicle.

DO NOT swerve back and forth to see around the paint truck or trail/buffer vehicle.

Motorists are asked to always use caution, reduce their speed and be alert to changing traffic conditions in all work zones.

Toombs County State Route 30, mile marker 2.41 to 17.05

Tattnall County State Route 147, mile marker 0 to 9.41

WHEN: Between the hours of 9 a.m. to 8 p.m., Tuesday, May 19, continuing through Friday, May 22, weather permitting
