Fresh stripes and RPMs going down on various local and state routes next week

What: Weather permitting, Georgia Department of Transportation contractors will be installing new road stripes and in some locations raised pavement markers (RPM) Monday through Saturday next week. Motorists are asked to use caution, reduce speed and remain alert to changing traffic conditions.

Raised pavement markers and new road stripes improve visibility for drivers at night and in inclement weather.

When: Monday, March 21 through Saturday, March 26 from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. on Wheeler Road, Walton Way and Wrightsboro Road in Richmond County; Monday, March 21 through Friday, March 25 at various times for hand work striping and/or RPM installs on SR 28/Washington Road, SR 56/Mike Padgett Highway, SR 23 and I-20.

Where: Striping:
Monday, March 21 on SR 28/Washington Road mile 7.5 to 11 from 7 p.m. to 12 a.m. **(Richmond County)**
Tuesday, March 22 through Friday, March 25 on SR 56/Mike Padgett Highway mile zero to 4.5 and mile 11.9 to 12.5 from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. **(Richmond County)**

RPMs:
Monday, March 21 on SR 23 mile 4.4 to 29.3 from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. **(Burke County)**
Tuesday, March 22 and Wednesday, March 23 on SR 28/Washington Road mile 7.5 to 11 from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. **(Richmond County)**

Thursday, March 24 through Friday, March 25 on I-20 mile 153 to 195 from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. (**Warren/McDuffie/Columbia counties**)
