Interstate 16...

New RPMs on I-16 Enhances Visibility and Safety for Motorists

What: Ozark Striping Co., a contractor for the Georgia Department of Transportation, is planning to install new raised pavement markers (RPMs) on Interstate 16 in southeast Georgia this week. The scheduled installation on I-16 will be between the hours of 9 a.m. until 8:30 p.m., Monday through Friday from mile post 111 to milepost 152 in Bulloch, Bryan, Effingham and Chatham Counties. Installation may change depending upon the weather and the contractor's schedule.

This is a slow-moving operation that requires rolling lane closures. Motorists are asked to use caution, reduce speed and remain alert to changing traffic conditions.

RPMs enhance safety by communicating important information to drivers, such as the alignment of the road. New RPMs are highly visible, especially at night and in inclement weather.

When: 9 a.m. until 8:30 p.m., June 20 through June 24, weather permitting.

Where: I-16 from mile post 111 to mile post 152 in Bulloch, Bryan, Effingham and Chatham Counties.
