CHANGES COMING TO MOULTRIE: Roundabout Intersection under Construction on State Route 33

Moultrie, Ga. - The Georgia Department of Transportation announces a construction project in Colquitt County is underway to transform the roads at the intersection of State Route (SR) 33/US 319 with Sylvester Highway and 1st Street on the north side of Moultrie into a roundabout. The change will improve the flow of traffic through the area and increase safety.

Monday, September 14, deceleration lane closures will occur on SR 33/US 319 onto Sylvester Highway and 1st Street to remain in place for the duration of this roundabout construction. Motorist traveling on SR 33/US 319 will have access to Sylvester Highway and 1st Street at the center of this intersection. Motorists should stay alert in this construction work zone due to personnel and heavy equipment will be working in close proximity to the roadway.

This \$2.4 million intersection improvement project was awarded to Reeves Construction Company of Albany. Construction of the roundabout intersection should be completed next summer 2016.

To use a roundabout - yield as you approach the entry points; traffic inside the roundabout has the right of way. All entering motorists should yield to vehicles in the roundabout approaching and then enter the roundabout with a right turn. All traffic circulates around the central island in a counterclockwise movement and makes a right turn to exit the roundabout.
