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GDOT CONTINUES PLACEMENT OF REFLECTIVE RAISED PAVEMENT MARKERS ON HIGHWAY 6 IN PAULDING COUNTY

DALLAS, Ga. – A Georgia DOT Maintenance crew continues today through Friday its work to replace the obliterated and damaged reflective raised pavement markers on State Route (SR) 6 in Paulding County. Work will proceed daily from 7:30 a.m. until 5:30 p.m. and will force pacing traffic on these highways. This maintenance operation and the lane closures it necessitate are weather permitting and subject to change.

Georgia DOT maintains over 2000 lane-miles in Northwest Georgia. This year's relatively harsh winter and snowplows used to clear the region's interstates and state routes from snow and ice present an autumn challenge to the DOT crews who are charged with maintaining lane markers on the roads. These crews follow Federal Highway Administration standards for markings and do their best to keep up. They also work almost continuously restriping faded markers and replacing missing reflective raised pavement markers. Still, the volume of traffic on the highways, snow removal in the winter and sunny summer all weigh heavily on the durability of the lane markers.
