RAILROAD CROSSING IMPROVEMENTS CONTINUE ON STATE ROUTE 149 IN SCOTLAND

One Day Closure

WHEN: 8 a.m. until 5 p.m., Thursday, August 29, weather permitting.

WHERE: S.R. 149 at Railroad Crossing in City of Scotland in Telfair County

WHAT: At the request of Norfolk Southern Corporation, the Georgia DOT announces a temporary road closure on S.R. 149 at Railroad Crossing in City of Scotland in Telfair County. This road closure is scheduled between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Thursday, August 29, weather permitting.

This railway maintenance operation and the road closures is a necessity to calibrate the railway creating a smooth transition for motorists and reduce continuous maintenance at this rail crossing. Motorists will be able to access businesses, schools, and residences in the area up to work zone.

The detour route will be signed as follows:

Eastbound

Northbound SR 149 traffic on SR 27 will continue north to McRae, turn East onto SR 30 then South onto SR 149 back to Scotland where detour ends.

Westbound

Eastbound traffic on SR 30 will continue east to McRae turning South onto SR 27 then North onto SR 149 back to Scotland where detour ends.

Note: S.R. 149 will remain open to local traffic up to the work zone.

*Motorists can access real-time, statewide, route-specific information on accidents, road work, traffic and weather conditions through **Georgia 511** - a free phone service. By dialing 511, callers also can transfer to operators to 24 hours a day to report incidents or request assistance. The system can be used to access transit providers, major airports, rideshare organizations, tourism information and 511 systems in surrounding states. Additionally, 511 is available online.
