Plan Ahead to Avoid Long Delays

MUCH OF THE SAME – I-285 AND I-20 EAST SIDE WORK CONTINUES THIS WEEKEND

ATLANTA – Work will continue this weekend on the top end and east side of I-285 as well as on I-20 just outside the east side perimeter, weather permitting. Motorists should plan ahead and seek alternate routes to avoid delays.

Across the top end, up to three lanes will be closed in both directions all weekend between Ashford Dunwoody Road and Powers Ferry Road for concrete slab replacements, bridge joint replacements and guardrail work in several locations. And, on I-285 on the east side, two left lanes northbound will be closed near Glenwood Avenue as crews perform sign structure work all weekend.

On I-20 eastbound, just outside the perimeter in Dekalb County from Columbia Drive to Wesley Chapel Road, two right lanes will be closed for pavement work.

Additionally, contractors will continue the construction of the bridges in the SR 400/I-85 interchange. Flagging operations on surface streets around the interchange and various lane closures on State Route 400 are expected to cause delays in the area so motorists should plan ahead to avoid the backups. The HOV ramps at I-85 and Lindbergh Drive also remain closed until mid July for work on the bridge columns for the interchange.

“We have a busy weekend planned on I-285 and I-20 east this weekend,” said GDOT District Construction Engineer Lee Upkins. “Plan ahead if you want to avoid the heavy traffic.”

SR 3 NB/SB, from MP 6.43 (South Marietta Parkway) to MP 6.61 (Frey Gin Road), Partial road closed at a time to place gas lines across and along side road on either side.

Cobb, 2/15/13 to 2/18/13, 9pm till 5am, continuous

I-285 WB/EB, from MP 19 (Cobb Parkway) to MP 18 (Paces Ferry Road), one right lane closed for guardrail replacement.

Cobb, 2/15/13 to 2/18/13, 9pm till 5am, continuous

I-285 NB, MP 18 (Paces Ferry Road) to MP 20 (I-75), one right lane closed for guardrail replacement.

Cobb, 2/16/13, 7am till 5pm

I-285 WB, from MP 21 (Powers Ferry Road) to MP 19 (Cobb Parkway), one right lane closed for barrier wall repair along exit #20.

Fulton, 5/4/12 to 1/31/13, 9am till 3pm, daily

Sidney Marcus Blvd EB/WB, from MP 1 (GA 400) to MP 2 (Buford Hwy), Left lane affected with flagging operations for construction activities.

Fulton, 5/15/13 to 2/28/13, 10pm till 10am, continuous

GA 400 NB, from MP 1 (I-85) to MP 1.2 (Sidney Marcus Blvd), one left shoulder closed for the construction of bridge foundations.

Fulton, 5/25/12 to 5/1/13, 10am till 4pm, continuous

SR 154 WB, from MP 34.16 (Capital Ave) to 34.02 (Memorial Drive), one right lane closed for construction of parking deck.

Fulton, 10/5/12 to 12/31/13, 4:30am till 3pm, daily

SR 400 SB, about MP 1 Sidney Marcus Blvd), single left lane closed for construction of bridge bents.

Fulton, 3/27/12 to 2/28/13, 7:30am till 3:30pm, daily

SR 141 NB/SB, from MP 1.8 (Roxboro Road) to MP 1.1 (Stratford Road), either outside lane closed for construction activities.

Fulton, 5/4/12 to 1/31/13, 9am till 3pm, daily

SR 13 NB/SB, from MP 2 (I-85) to MP 3 (Lenox Road), one outside lane closed with flagging operations to support construction activities.

Fulton, 1/7/13 to 6/30/13, 9am till 5pm, daily

Deering Road EB, about MP 0 (Peachtree Street), Deering Road closed for construction on the Amtrak Station.

Fulton, 1/22/13 to 7/22/13, 7pm till 5am, continuous

I-85 NB/SB, from MP 0 to MP 0.25 (Lindbergh Drive), HOV Ramp closed on to construct bridge bent #11.

Fulton, 1/12/13 to 12/31/13, 7pm till 5:30pm, weekly

Sidney Marcus Blvd EB/WB, from MP .5 to MP 1 (Sidney Marcus Blvd), road closed on Saturdays only for construction activities.

Fulton, 1/12/13 to 12/28/13, 7am till 5:30 pm, weekly

Cheshire Bridge Road EB/WB, from MP 0 to MP 0.25 (Sheridan Road), Road Closed on Saturdays only for construction activities.

Fulton, 1/12/13 to 12/28/13, 7am till 3:30pm, weekly

SR 13NB, from MP 0 to MP 0.25 (Lenox Road), road closed on Saturdays only for construction activities.

Fulton, 1/23/13 to 4/1/13, 9am till 4pm, daily

Bolton Road WB, from MP 3.42 (Marietta Blvd) to MP 2.52 (Paul Ave), one right lane closed for demolition and sidewalk installation.

Fulton, 1/24/13 to 2/8/13, 9am till 4pm, daily

Danforth Road EB, from 0.13 (New Hope Road to MP 0.68 (Rehoboth Circle), one right lane closed for construction activities.

Fulton, 2/1/13 to 2/28/13, 10pm till 5am, daily

I-75/I-85 NB, from MP 245.7 (Capital Ave) to MP 247.7 (I-20), HOV lane closed for pouring concrete on median barrier.

Fulton, 2/4/13 to 2/18/13, 9am till 4pm, daily

SR 14 SB, about MP 5 (Fairburn Ind Blvd), one right lane closed for utility gas line work.

Fulton, 2/15/13 to 2/18/13, 9pm till 5am, continuous

I-285 EB, from MP 25 (Roswell Rd) to MP 28 (Peachtree Dunwoody Rd), three left lanes closed bridge joint repair.

DeKalb, 5/14/12 to 4/30/13, 9am till 4pm, daily

SR 42 SB, from MP 13.17 (North Druid Hills Road) to MP 13.12 (Briarcliff Road), right shoulder closed for construction activities.

DeKalb, 2/8/13 to 2/18/13, 8pm till 5am, continuous

I-20 EB, from MP 66 (Columbia Drive) to MP 68 (Wesley Chapel Road), two right lanes closed for milling shoulder, placing GAB, and new asphalt on the existing shoulder.

DeKalb, 2/15/13 to 2/18/13, 9pm till 5am, continuous,

I-285 NB, about MP 45 (Glenwood Road), two left lanes closed to remove concrete barrier wall and the placement of concrete sign footings.

DeKalb, 2/15/13 to 2/18/13, 9pm till 5am, continuous

I-285 WB, form MP 29 (Ashford Dunwoody Rd) to MP 26 (Glenridge Rd), three left lanes closed for the replacement of bridge joints.
