Windsor Spring Road project work affecting drivers

HEPHZIBAH- E.R. Snell Contractor's continued work on the \$27.7 million Windsor Spring Road Phase 4 project requires some lane closures and traffic shift from Inverness Drive to Anthony Dejuan Parkway this week.

Daily lane closures begin **Monday, Nov. 14** and should last through **Friday, Nov. 18** from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. for grading and storm drain installs. The Georgia DOT contractor has also scheduled a traffic shift in the same area onto new temporary widening **Wednesday, Nov. 16**, weather permitting.

Overall, this 3.3-mile long widening project begins south of the intersection of Windsor Spring Road and Willis Foreman Road and terminates at the intersection of Windsor Spring Road and Tobacco Road. The existing two-lane facility will be widened to four, 11-foot wide lanes separated by a raised median. An eight-foot-wide multi-use trail will be constructed on both sides of the roadway. Improvements also include the construction of a bridge and approaches over Spirit Creek.

Whenever you approach a work zone: slow down; allow extra distance between vehicles; read signs; obey road crew flaggers; and expect the unexpected.
