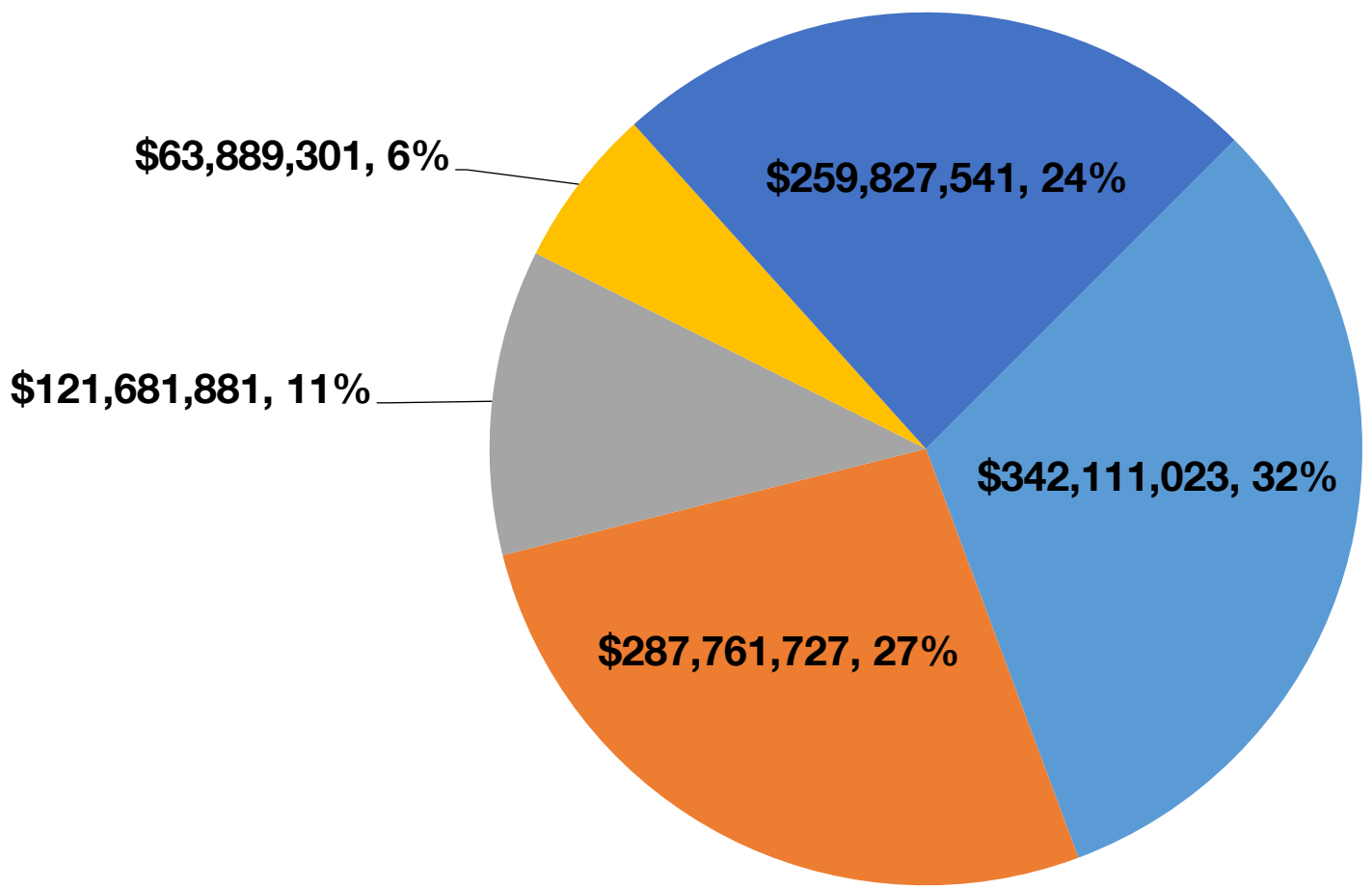

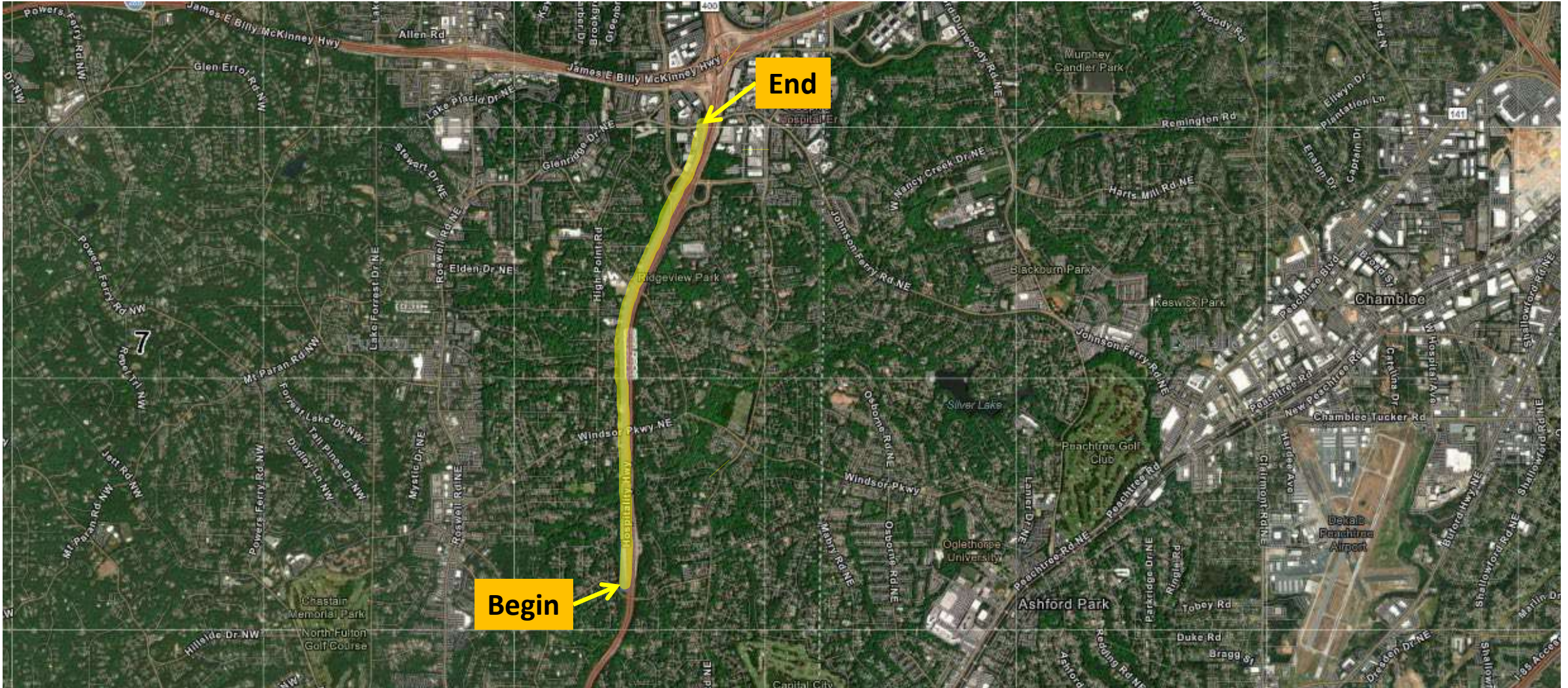

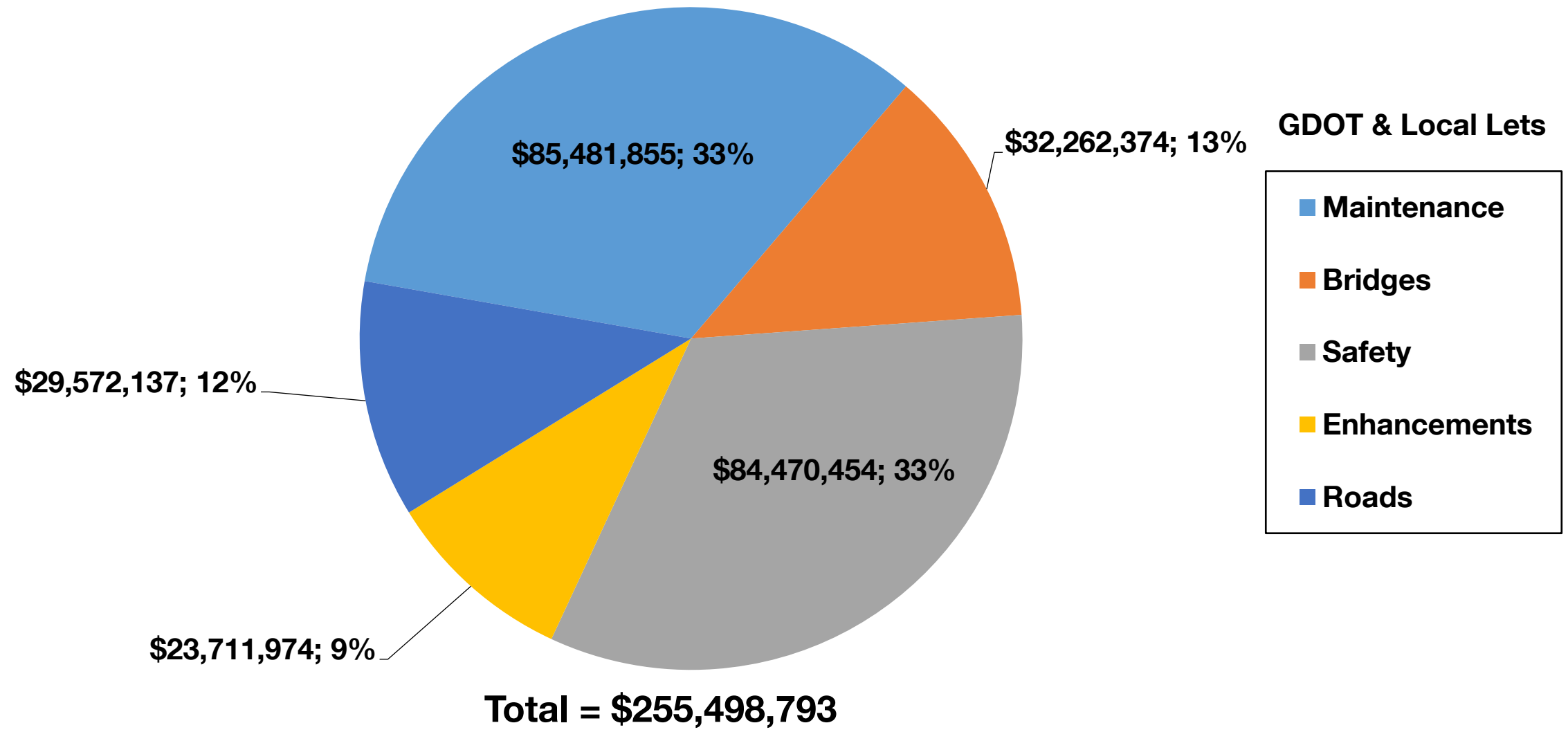

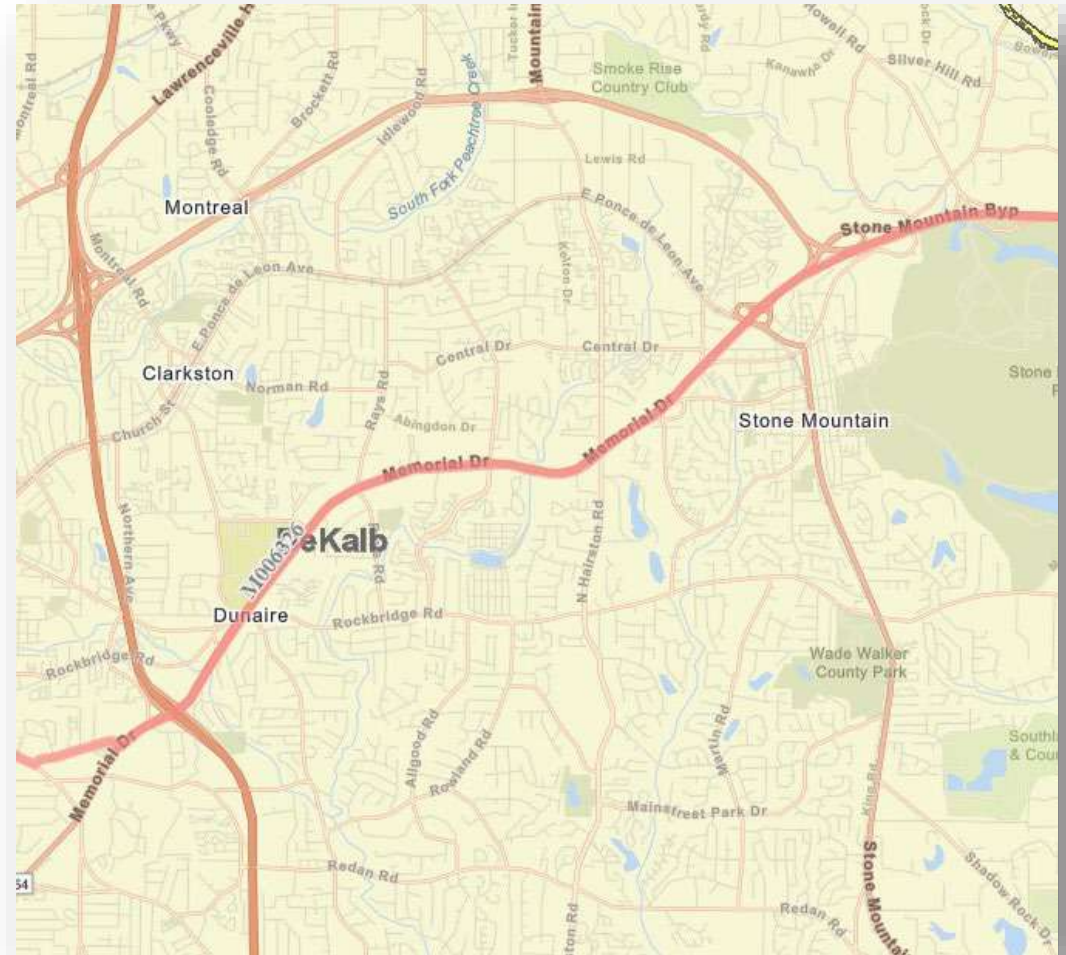

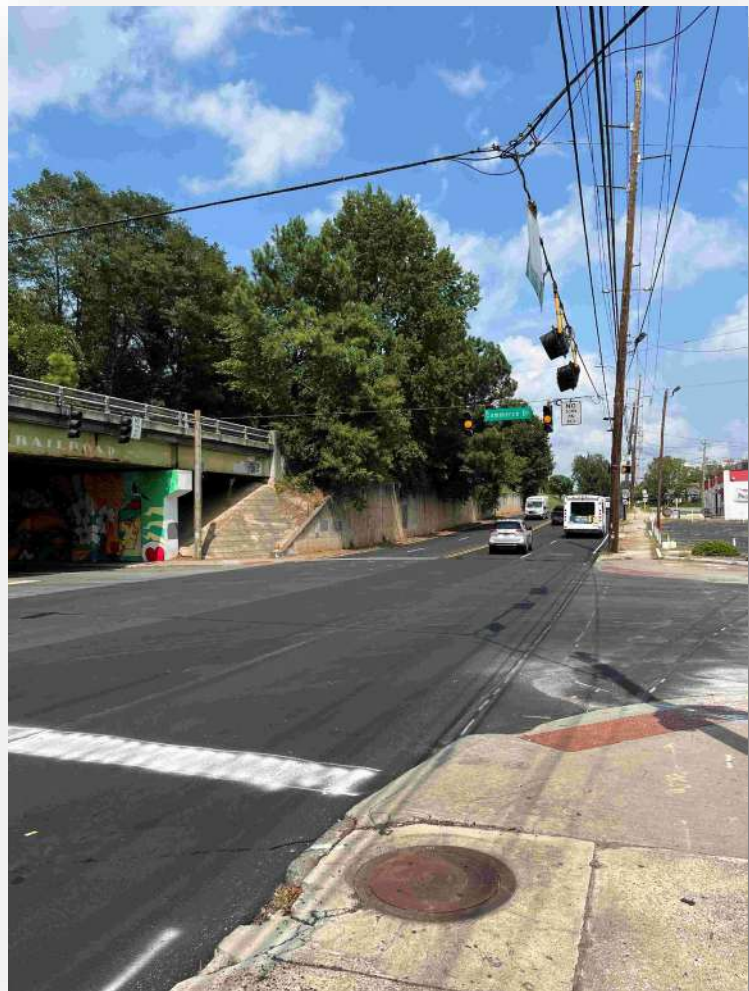

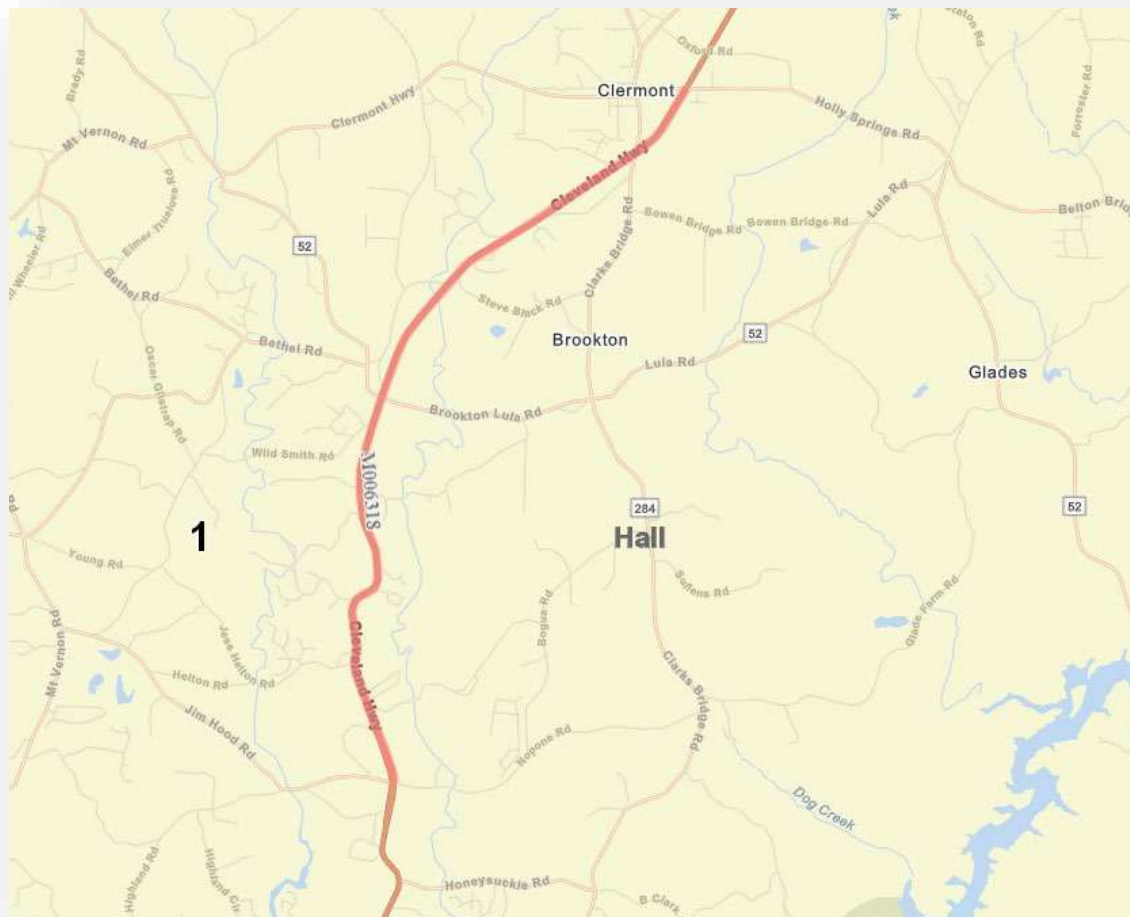

Policy Resolution PR-4-23

Title: State DOTs Commitment to Address the National Roadway Safety Crisis

Whereas, 42,795 lives were lost across the nation in 2022 from traffic crashes, and pedestrian fatalities increased from 4,280 in 2010 to 7,388 in 2021;

Whereas, these fatalities and serious injuries on our nation's transportation facilities continue to represent a wholly unacceptable public health crisis;

Whereas, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, the total value of societal harm from motor vehicle crashes in 2019 was nearly \$1.4 trillion when quality-of-life valuations are considered;

Whereas, improvements in safety for vehicle occupants have been more than offset by persistent increases in behaviors including excessive speeding, distraction, impairment, and lack of use of personal safety devices;

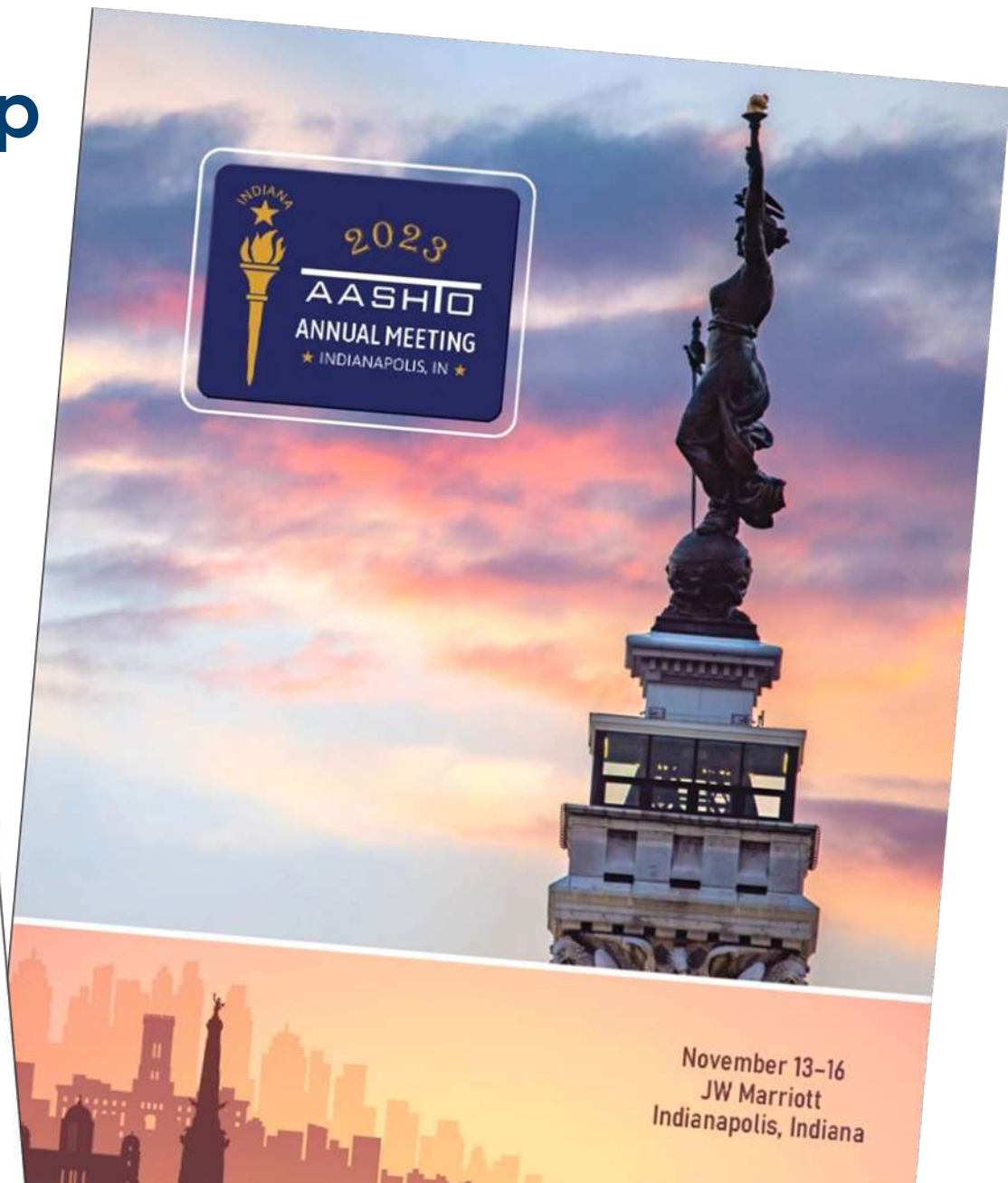
Whereas, increasingly, state departments of transportation (state DOTs) have advanced investing in, planning, designing, building, and operating our roads and streets to enable mobility and convenience while ensuring the safety of all road users;

Whereas, underserved neighborhoods, rural communities, and communities of color have generally experienced disproportionate number of traffic fatalities and serious injuries;

Whereas, the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials' (AASHTO) 2021-2026 Strategic Plan focuses on the goal of safety, mobility, and access for everyone;

Whereas, AASHTO and its state DOT members continue to build upon our history of providing solutions to transportation challenges by exploring, developing, and implementing transportation improvements;

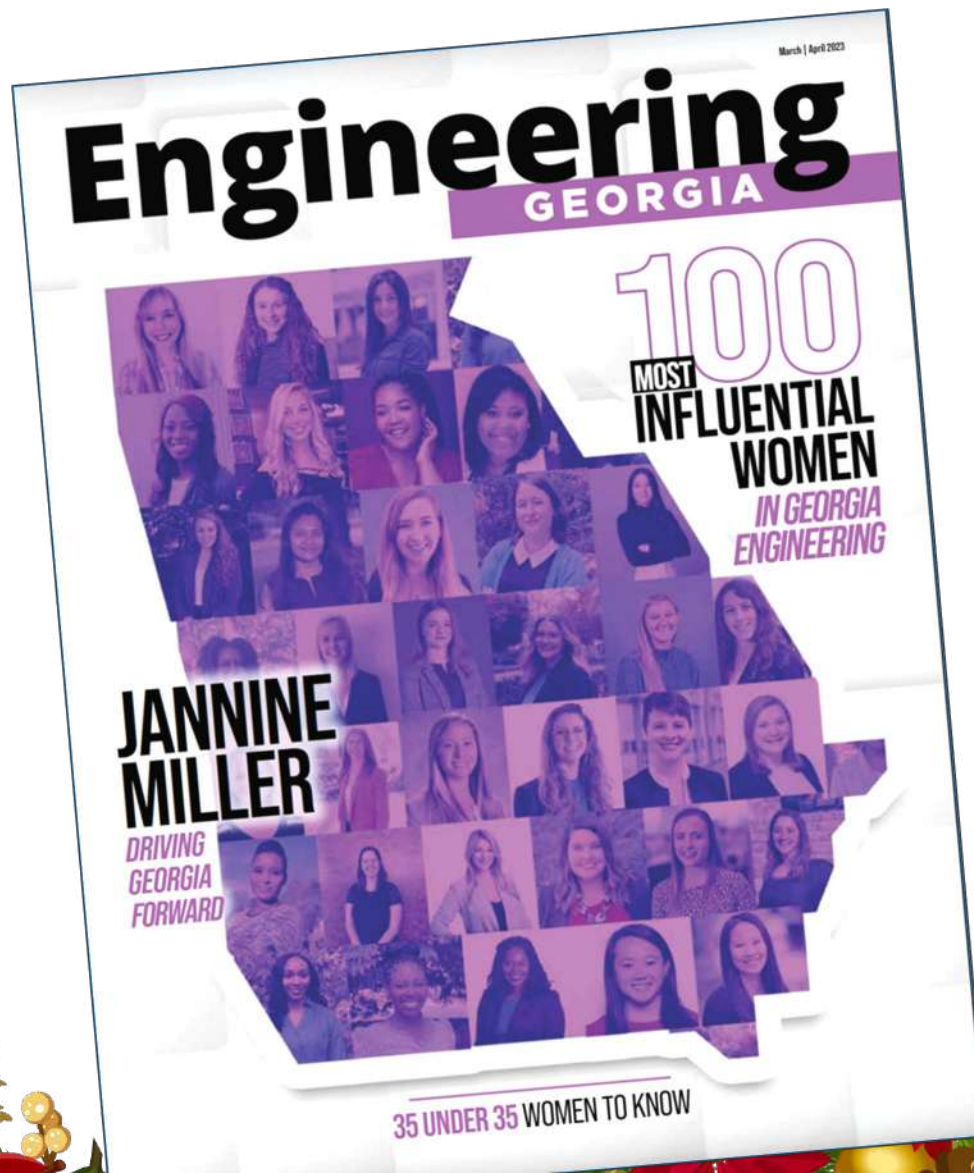

How big and vital is Atlanta's Hartsfield-Jackson International Airport? In 2015, it became the first airport in the world to surpass 100 million passengers in one year. Traffic peaked at a record 110 million passengers in 2019. The pandemic changed everything the following year, but ATL is soaring back. Traffic rose 24% last year from 2021 levels to 94 million passengers, easily qualifying the airport as the world's busiest. The infrastructure law has already sent [Georgia](#) more than \$302 million for its airports to help manage all that growth. After you arrive in the Peach State, you will find plenty of room to thrive. Office space and vacant sites are abundant. And roads and bridges are in good shape in America's most solid state.
