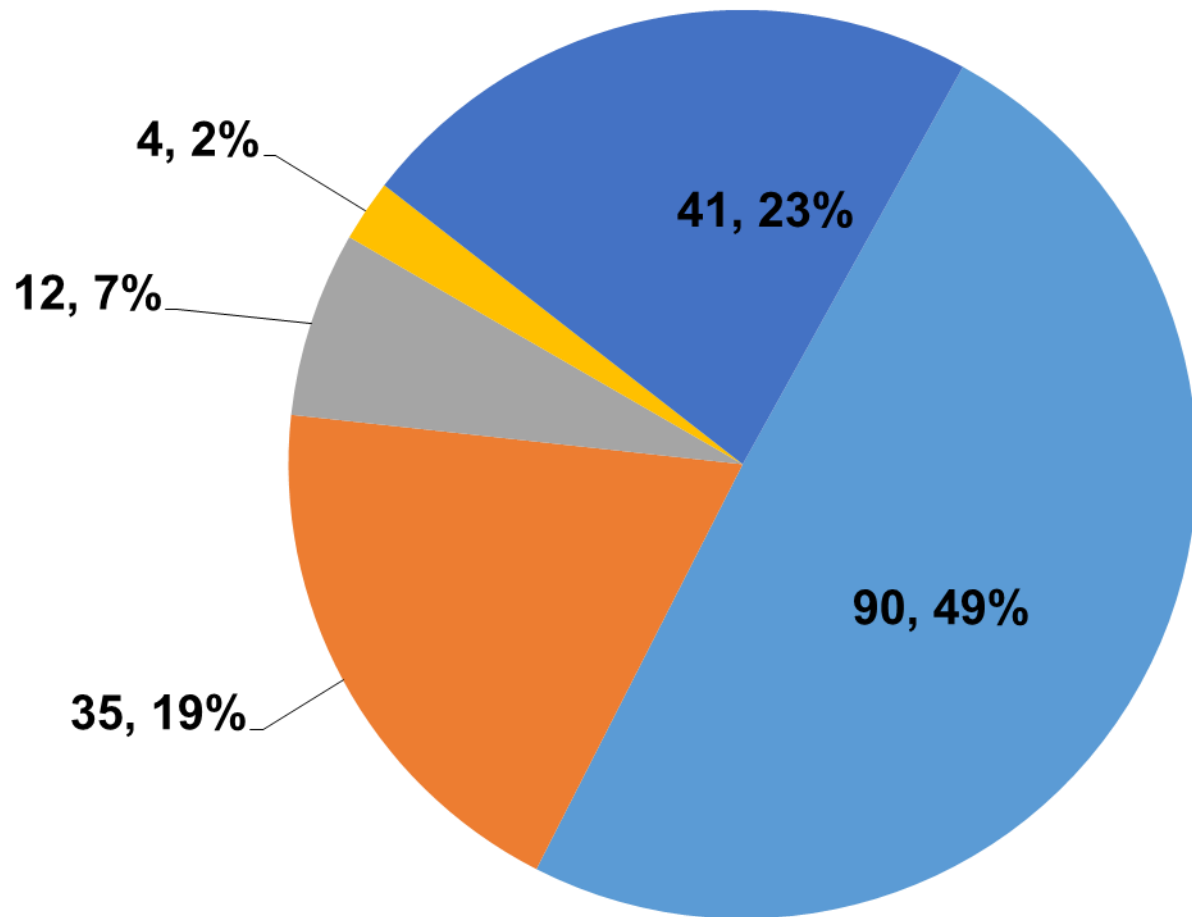

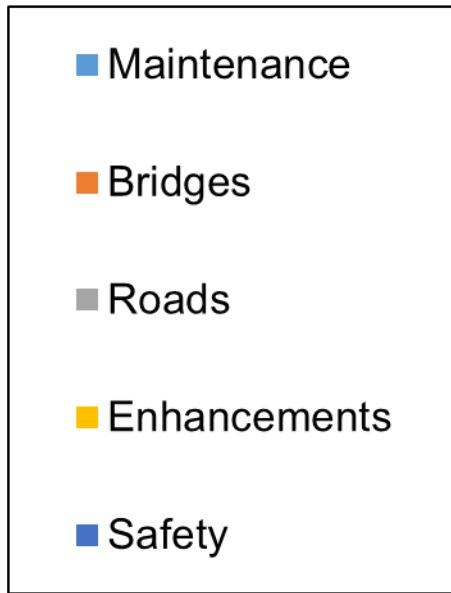


Fiscal Year 2026 Letting Report Number of Projects Let in FY 2026 (Contractor Low Bid Award Data)

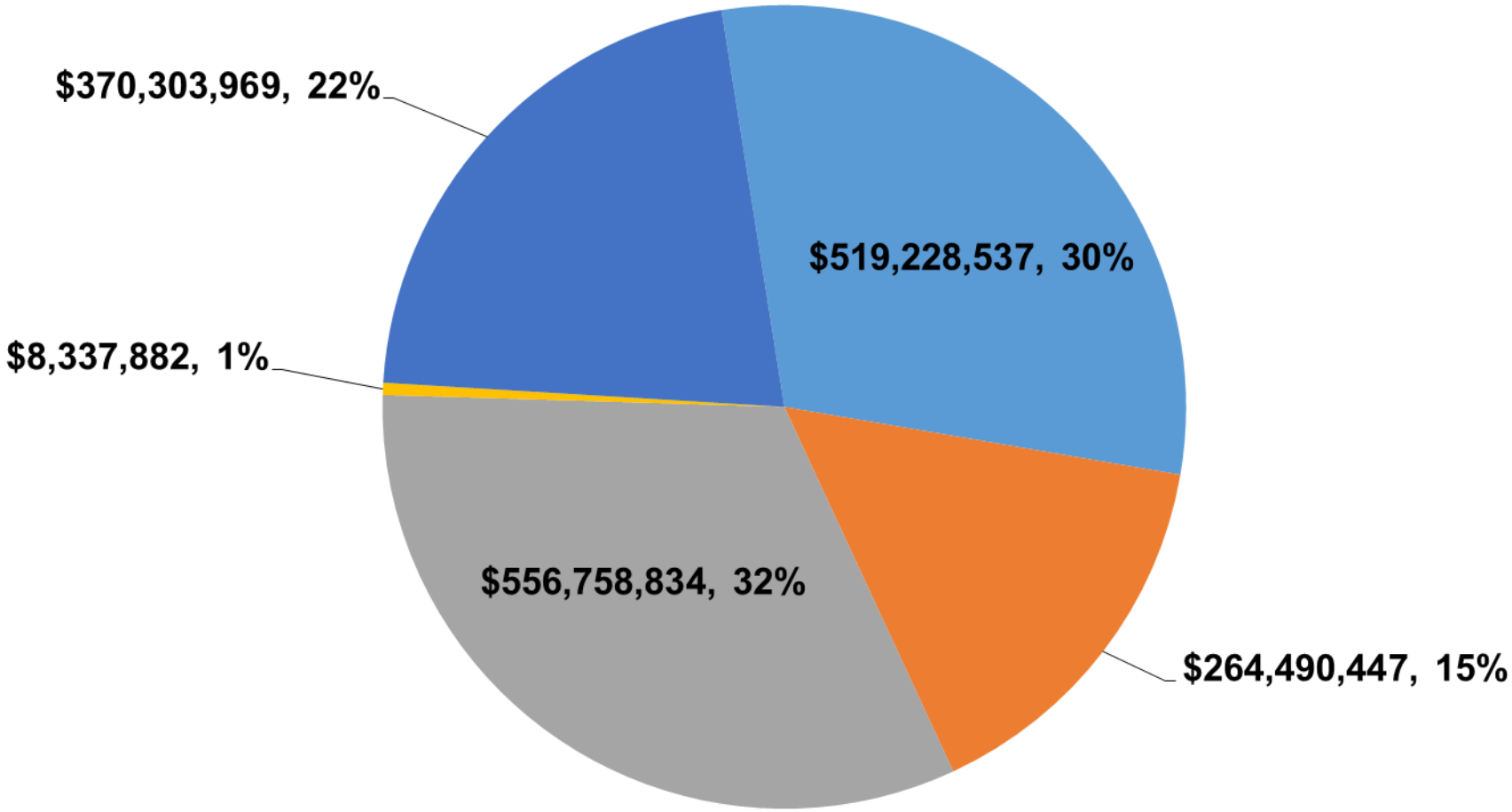

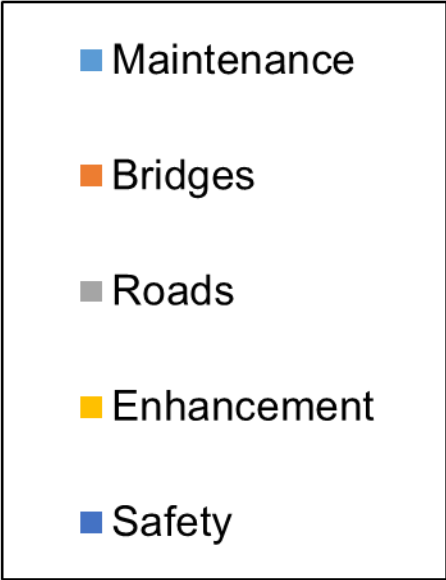

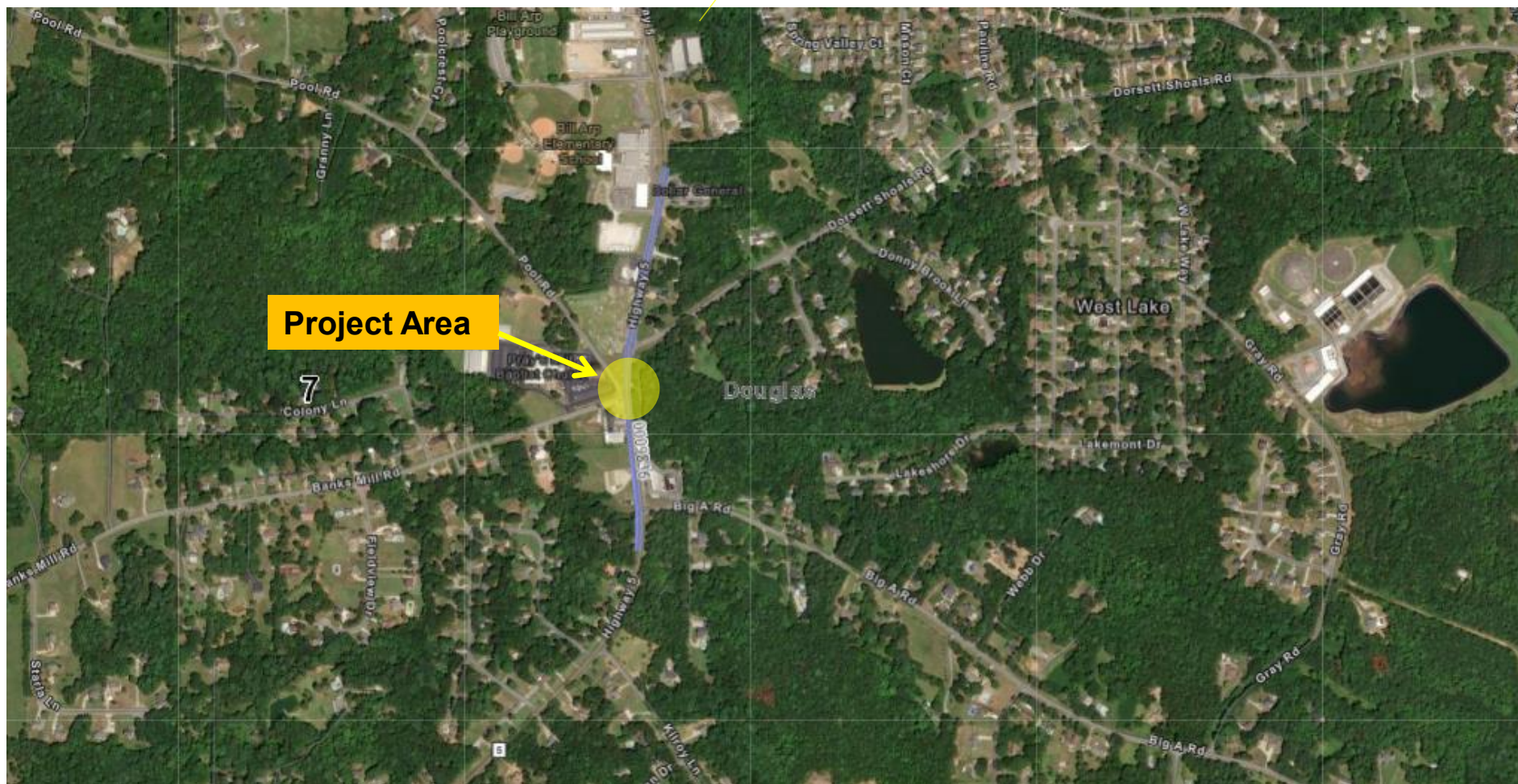

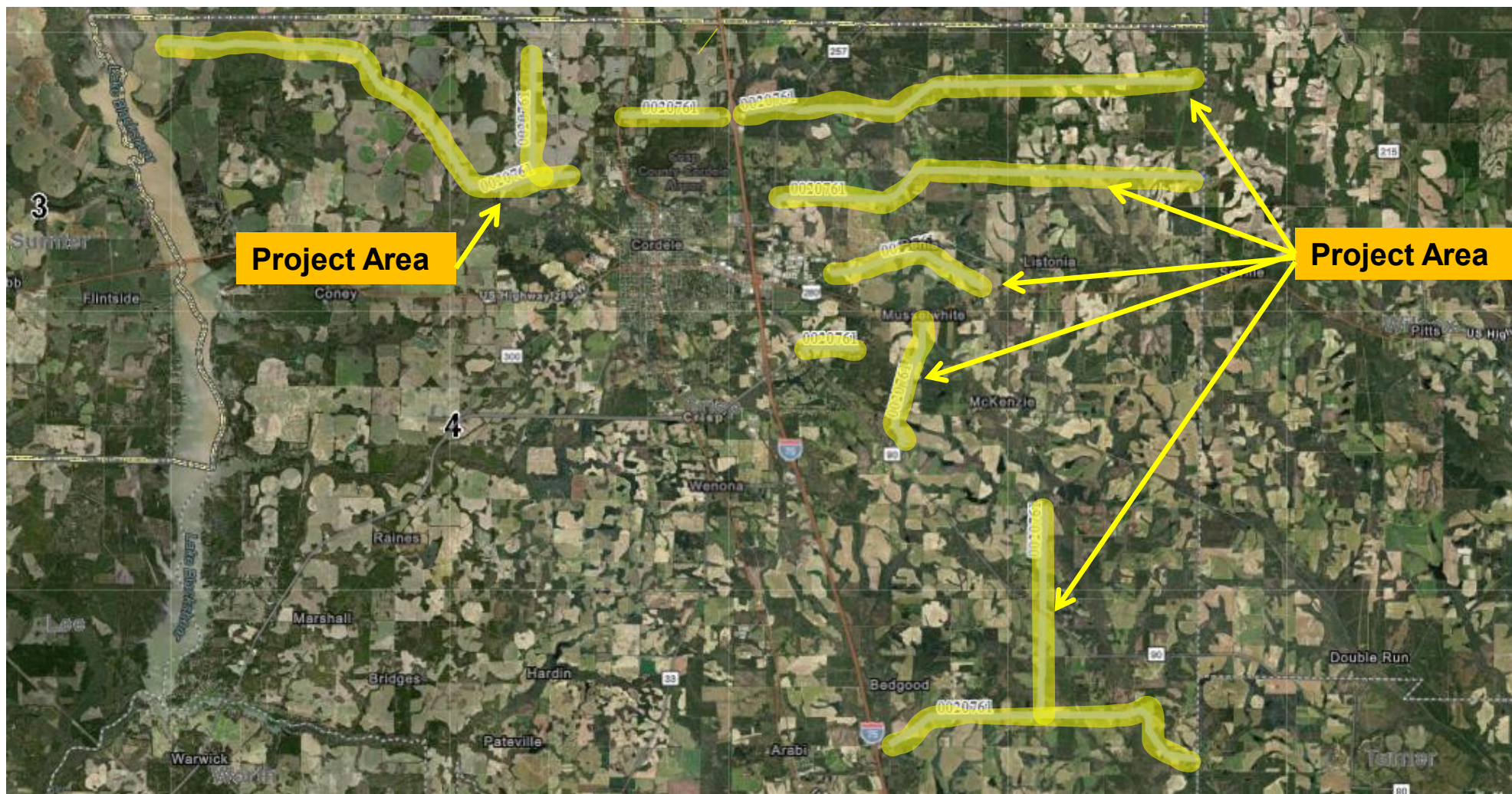

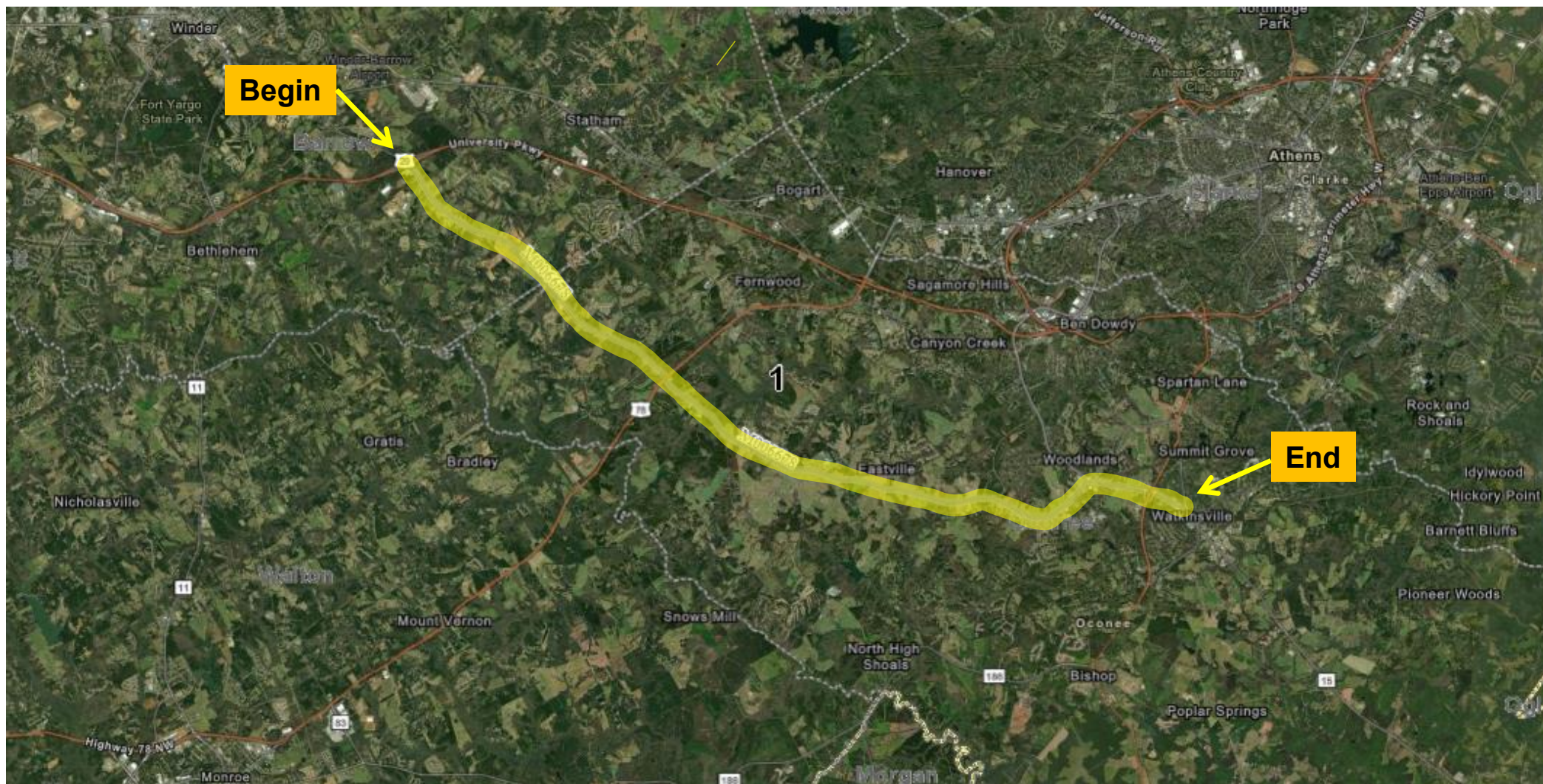

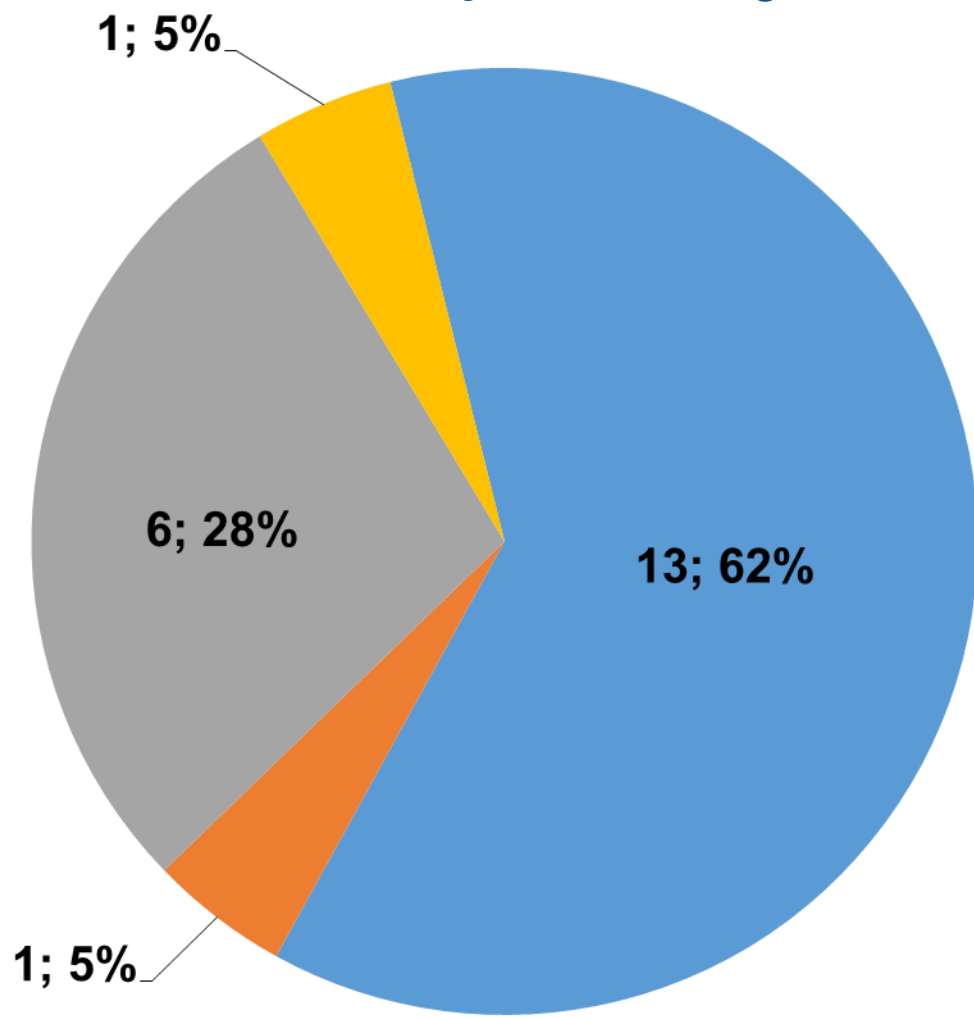

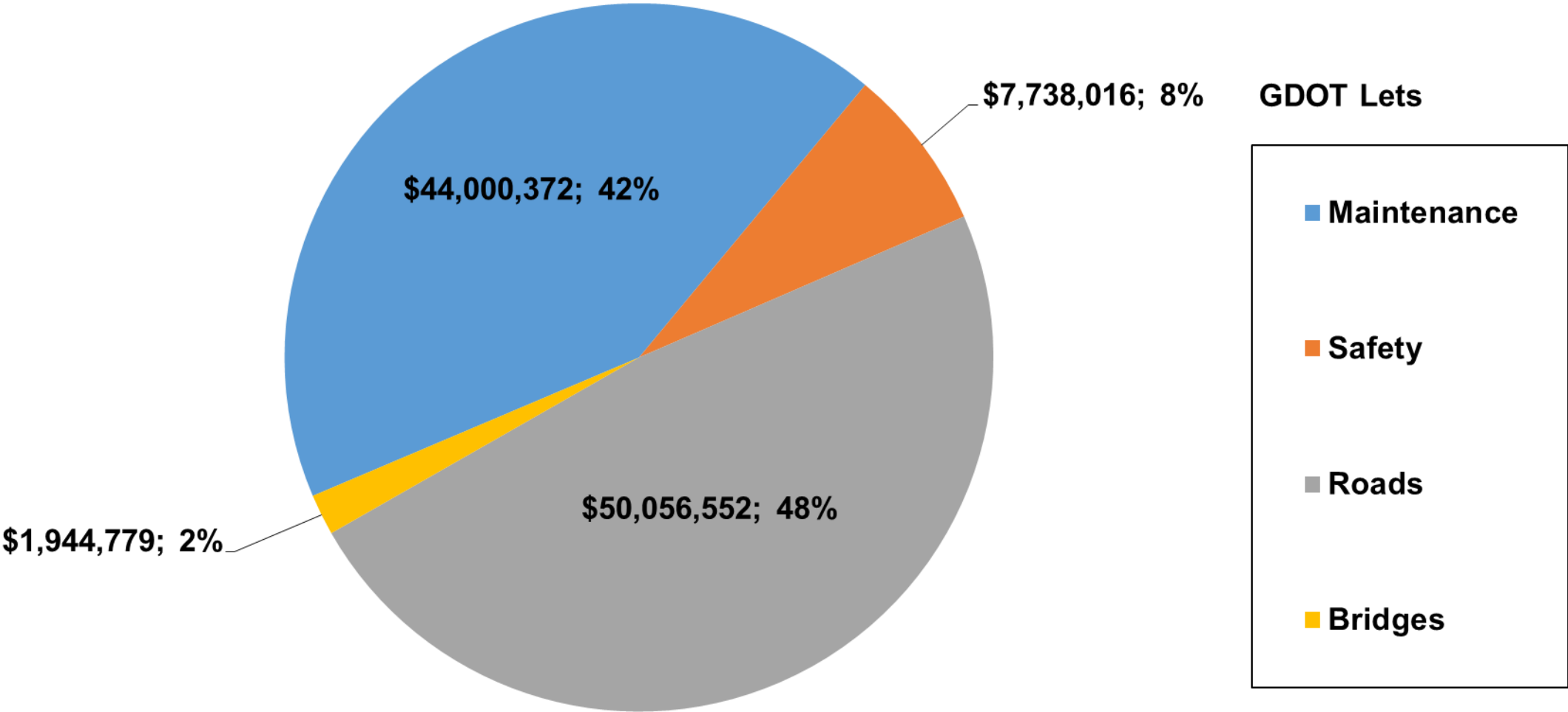

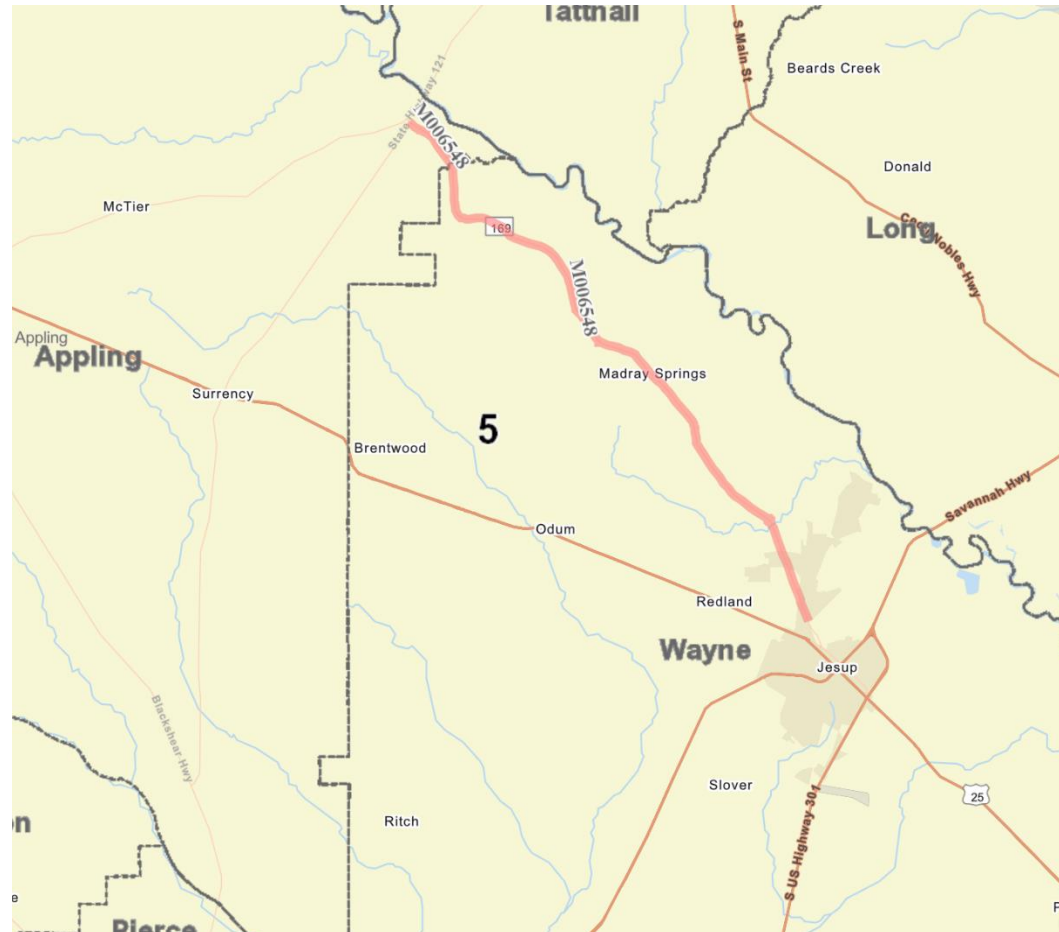

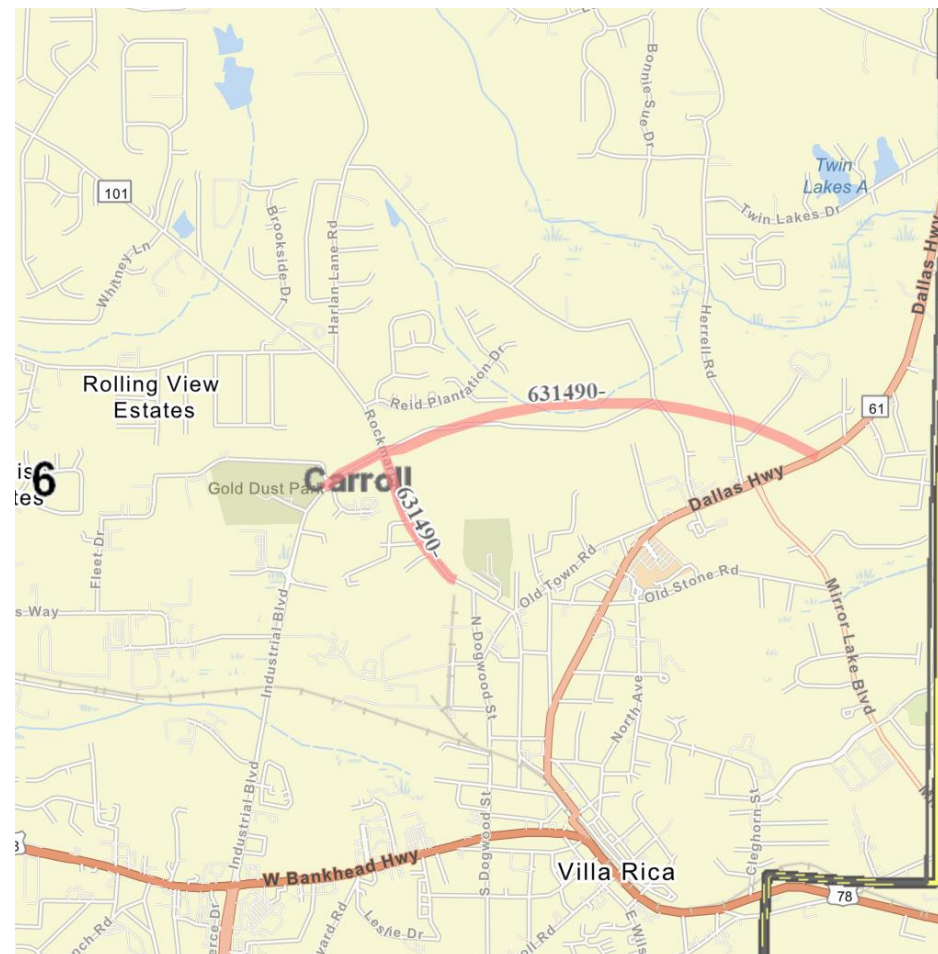

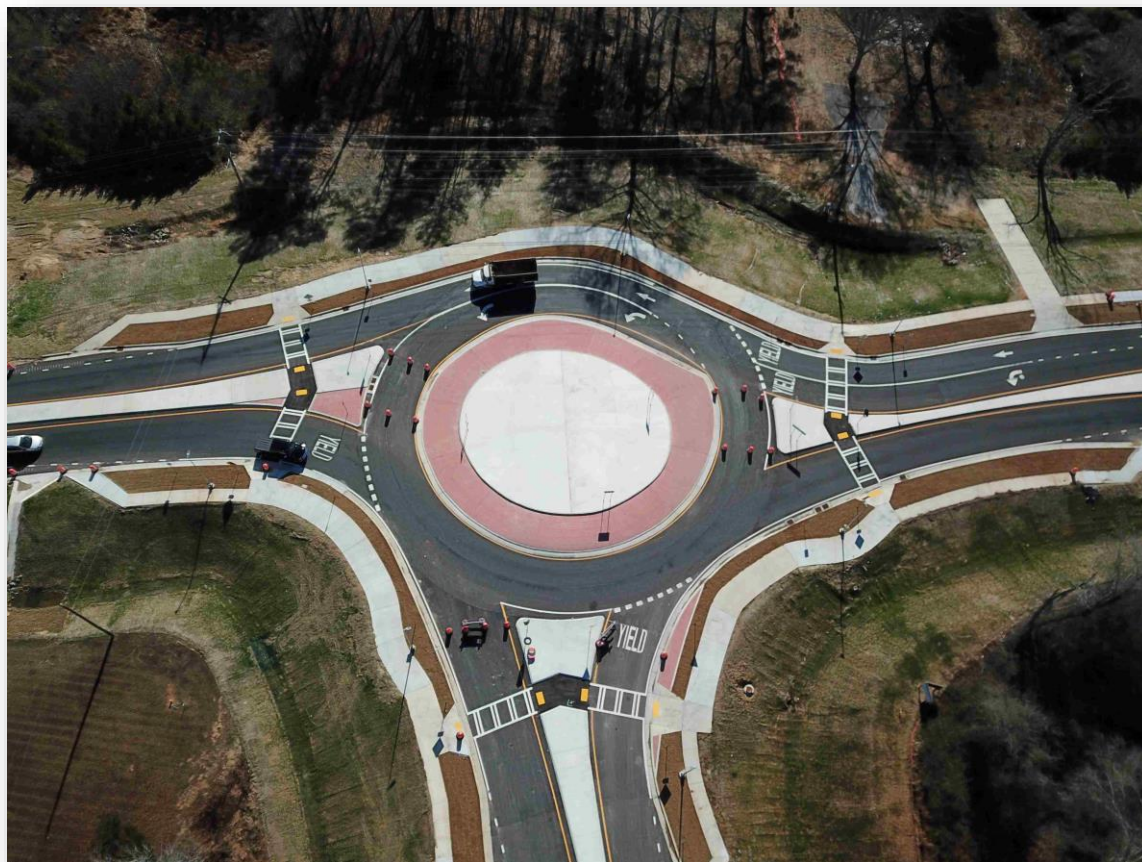

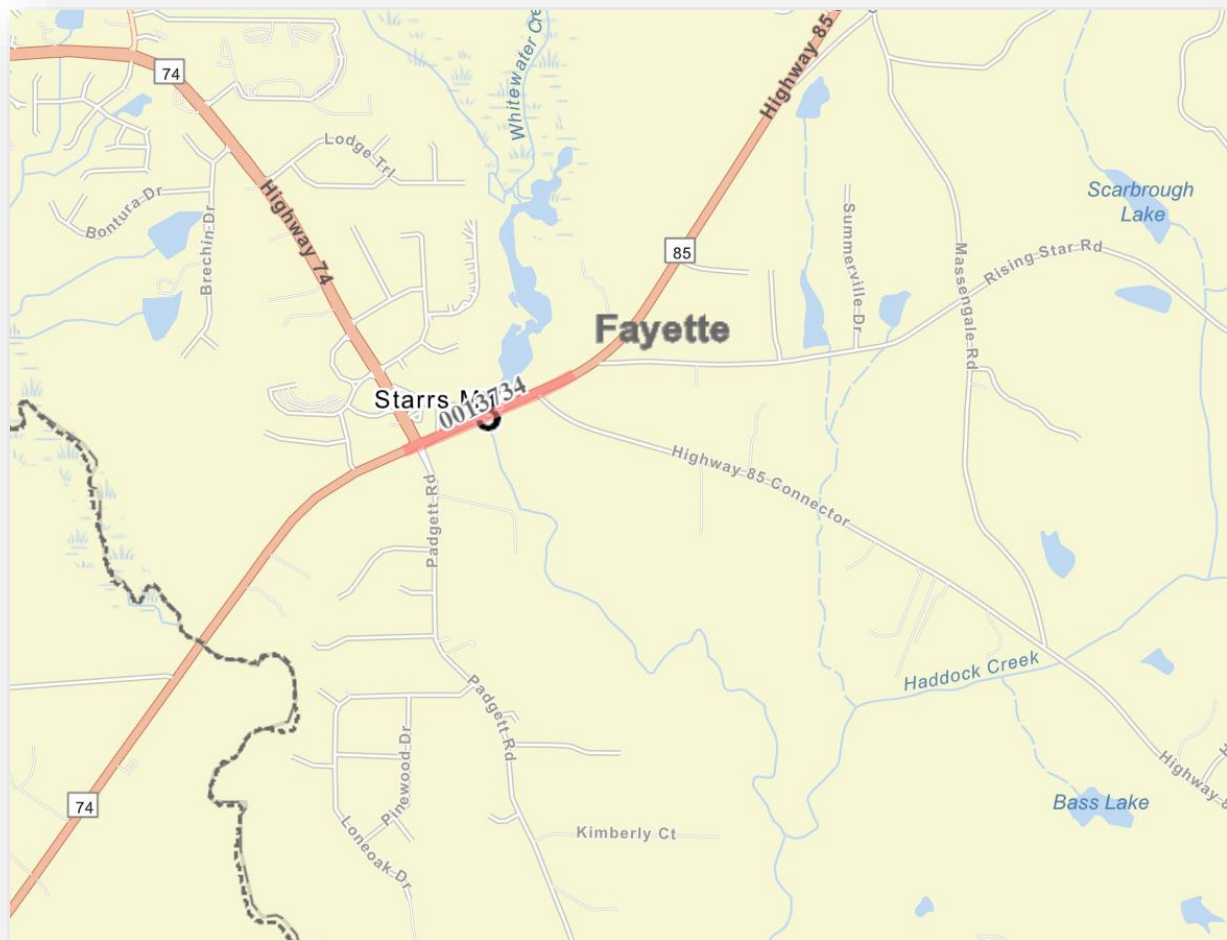

Georgia DOT Fights Human Trafficking

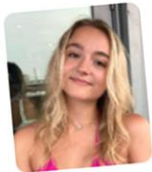

- **Multi-Agency Coordination:** Establishing Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs) and embedding liaisons across transportation, law enforcement, and emergency operations for seamless information flow.

“Well, I had a new experience tonight. I had the misfortune to strike an object on I-285 in fairly heavy traffic at approximately 2200 hours (10 o'clock PM for those who don't understand military time). I don't know what it was, but it blew out my left front tire. I got across the two adjacent lanes and into the emergency lane, where I stopped. Being dark and fairly heavy traffic, I did not feel safe changing the tire next to the traffic lane, so I called 511. The operator said someone would be with me shortly. In less than 19 minutes, help arrived, and after I got the kit out to lower the spare from under the rear of my truck, the HERO operator had my tire changed and had me ready to continue home in short order. I asked him if there was a charge and he said, "No sir, this is a free service." I asked if I could tip him and he said, "No sir, we are not allowed to accept tips, you are ready to go, have a good night." I am sorry I didn't get his name, because I feel that tonight he was a lifesaver. I am much impressed with the Georgia HERO units.”
