
There is an estimated 500 citation that have been written just in the city of Thomasville just for the use of Cellphones or other electronic devices while driving.

NO TEXTING WHILE DRIVING



A driver may not send or read any text-based communication unless using voice-based communication that automatically converts message to a written text or is being used for navigation or GPS.





A driver may not watch a video unless it is for navigation. A driver may not record a video (continuously running dash cams are exempt).

EXCEPTIONS

- Reporting a traffic crash, medical emergency, fire, criminal activity or hazardous road conditions.
- An employee or contractor of a utility service provider acting within the scope of his/her employment while responding to a utility emergency.
- A first responder (law enforcement, fire, EMS) during the performance of his/her official duties.
- When in a lawfully parked vehicle—this DOES NOT include vehicles stopped for traffic signals and stop signs on the public roadway.



NO HANDS-ON TALKING WHILE DRIVING

Drivers cannot have a phone in their hand or use any part of their body to support their phone. Drivers can only us their phones to make or receive phone calls by using speakerphone, earpiece, wireless headphone, phone is connected to vehicle or an electronic watch. GPS navigation devices are allowed.





A driver may not send or read any e-mails, social media or other internet content

COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLE OPERATORS

- Commercial Motor Vehicle Operators can only use one button to begin or end a phone call.
- Cannot reach for a wireless telecommunications device or stand-alone electronic device so that it no longer requires the driver to be in a seated position or properly restrained by a safety belt.
