


#1: GDOT is leading the ATL-SAV project and coordinating with many stakeholder organizations.

GDOT's role in rail planning:

- Responsible for the State Rail Plan and freight and passenger rail planning
- Member of the Southeast Corridor Commission
- Recipient of federal funds and provides state matching dollars for the project








#2: ATL-SAV has been accepted into the new federal Corridor ID Program

What is Corridor ID?

FRA-led program that sets standards for intercity passenger rail development with the purpose of creating a pipeline of projects ready for implementation. Sponsors follow three steps through the Corridor ID Program. For more information: <u>https://railroads.dot.gov/corridor-ID-program</u>.







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#4: This project will result in a Service Development Plan (SDP) and initiate the environmental process


FRA defines the scope and schedule for an SDP

The SDP encompasses several crucial activities including identifying the purpose and need for the passenger rail service, performing a thorough alternative analysis and conducting high level engineering, planning and environmental work.

#5: GDOT will begin by evaluating a wide range of options between Atlanta and Savannah


The route and station options are currently being developed

• All feasible options will be considered

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Six Things to Know

- An evaluation methodology will drive
 the development of alternatives
- Input from stakeholders will influence the universe of options and evaluation criteria





#6: Freight Rail is important to the State and vital to our economy

The project aims to support passenger and freight movement

- Freight railroads are key stakeholders
- Early coordination with railroads to collect information on current and future conditions
- A route has not been determined at this time
- Shared-use corridors are common with intercity service across the country, but do not necessary occur with all corridors

Preliminary Purpose Statement

The purpose of the Project is to establish a safe, reliable, high-capacity, and resilient intercity passenger rail service between the Atlanta and Savannah metro areas and travel markets in between.





Preliminary Needs

- Provide a Safe alternative mode of travel

- Connectivity between Georgia's existing intercity rail services, airports, and transit hubs









Stakeholder Engagement
