RoadWorks 2014 Program Continues; On Time, On Budget...

WORK TO BEGIN SOON ON REPLACING TWO BRIDGES ON HIGHWAY 225 IN GORDON COUNTY

CALHOUN, Ga. - Work could begin soon on replacing the two bridges on State Route (SR) 225 over New Town Creek and the Coosawatee River in Gordon County. Georgia DOT has just awarded a contract to Talley Construction Company, Inc. of Rossville, Georgia, valued at nearly seven million dollars for a construction project to replace the two bridges on SR 225 at these locations.

The project includes 0.909 mile of construction of two bridges and approaches on SR 225 over New Town Creek and Coosawatee River in Gordon County. The two existing bridges were structurally evaluated and classified as structurally deficient due to the load capacity and recommended for replacement. The project also includes the realignment of SR 225 in conjunction with the replacement of the two bridges to improve operation and safety.

This new construction project is scheduled to be completed by the end of March 2017, at a construction cost of \$6,667,555. Information on construction and lane closure schedules on this project will be forthcoming before work begins.
