GEORGIA DOT WANTS YOUR INPUT: Project on State Route 26 to Improve Travel in Bulloch County

STATESBORO, Ga. – Georgia DOT announces a Public Information Open House meeting to discuss the proposed roadway construction project to improve future travel conditions on State Route (SR) 26/US 80 between Statesboro and Brooklet in Bulloch County.

The public is encouraged to come out to view the details and discuss the project with Georgia DOT staff and give comments. The public meeting is scheduled for Thursday, December 18 from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. at W.W. Mann Retreat Center located at 2171 Prather Road in the City of Statesboro. There will be no formal presentation, so stop by at any point during the meeting.

This 3.4 mile long project proposes to construct passing and turning lanes on SR 26/US 80 from County Round (CR) 491/Amanda Road to CR 423/Old Lee field Road just outside of Brooklet in Bulloch County. The project includes two sections of 12-foot passing lanes and 12-foot turning lanes along the corridor.

After the open house, you can view the display of the project from December 19 through January 7 at the GDOT Statesboro Area Office located US Hwy 301 N in Statesboro. The plan will also be available online at the DOT website at www.dot.ga.gov. On the home page choose “Public Outreach” in yellow tab on the right-hand side then select the project’s County and choose go. A list of DOT projects in that County will appear and you can select the one you’d like to view. Newer projects are at the bottom of the project list. To leave comments online chose Comment header and follow the instructions.
