I-20 @ Savannah River Bridge Replacement

Fact Sheet

What is the Project?

Georgia DOT and South Carolina DOT's joint funded project is replacing and widening the existing I-20 bridges over the Augusta Canal and Savannah River from the Georgia Welcome Center to West Martintown Road (Exit 1) in South Carolina. Project parameters are within the city of Augusta, Richmond County, Georgia, and the city of North Augusta, Aiken County, South Carolina.

5 Things You Need to Know

- 1. This project is the first bi-state Design-Build (DB) initiative in Georgia.
- 2. The project will widen 1.8 miles of I-20, replace four bridges over the Augusta Canal and Savannah River, and make intersection improvements at the I-20 and West Martintown Road Interchange (Exit 1) in South Carolina.
- **3.** By widening from four lanes to six lanes the reconstructed bridges will be better suited to handle current and future traffic volumes.
- 4. The project will add a new signal at the I-20 eastbound off-ramp and West Martintown Road.
- 5. Recreational users of the canal and the tow path should see limited closures throughout the construction of the bridge.

What's The Status?

The project was awarded to the Design-Build team Superior Construction/WSP and construction began in December 2019. Work on the West Martintown Road signal has been completed and is in use. Construction on the bridges is underway and the project is expected to reach Substantial Completion in 2024.
